

Backyard Buffet

ith the recent cold snap poor our birdy population are probably feeling it. То give your feathered friends a helping hand this month pop out some extra food. You can attract many birds by putting out fat balls and you can easily make them at home, varying them to your local bird species by choosing different seeds and fruit to appeal to defferent species.

Birds have very high metabolisms and demand high amounts of energy to maintain their daily activities. Fat is a great way to help them replenish the energy stores lost during nesting, migration, and cold weather. It's also a great way to lure bird species to your backyard that might otherwise ignore your seed feeders.

BASIC FRUIT BALL

Ingredients:

450g to 700g fat or animal suet 3/4 cup millet (red and white mixed, if possible) 1/3 cup cracked corn 3/4 cup bird seeds 3/4 cup raisins or crab apples 1 to 2 tablespoons of honey (optional) mesh bags, or small plastic containers (margarine, sour cream, yogurt, etc.) waxed paper glass jar

Directions:

Chop the fat into small pieces and melt in a saucepan over low heat until it turns to liquid. Once the fat is melted, strain and remove any floating particles, including any remaining traces of meat.

Let the liquid fat cool slightly and stir in the other ingredients. Don't worry about exact measurements. Just add in whatever you think is needed.

Line small plastic containers with waxed paper and pour in the mix.

Refrigerate containers until they start to harden, and then store them in the freezer until ready for use. For ball-shaped feeders, remove the suet from their containers while still slightly warm and shape it into balls with your hands. Gently poke a hole through the centre of the ball with a chopstick and thread with string to hang it up with. Place the balls in plastic bags and store them in the freezer.



Fruit: If you (or perhaps your neighbours) grow cherry or other fruit trees, collect fruit with insect holes or bird damage, and cut it into halves or quarters. Other good choices for fruits include native berries like elderberries, mountain ash, and hawthorn. Store fruit in the freezer until you make the suet. It can be added to recipes while still frozen.

Fat: If you eat meat, one way to acquire fat for suet recipes is to trim the excess from meats before cooking them, or save the drippings. Freeze fat in labeled plastic bags until you are ready to use it. Scraps of fat can also be sourced from local butchers. It's also available in the meat section of some grocery stores. Experts disagree about whether birds digest pork fat as easily as beef fat, but most agree that lard and vegetable shortening are not good substitutes.

Offering Suet to Backyard Birds:

Fat cakes can be set out for birds while still frozen. Pop it out of its container and if necessary, cut it into smaller pieces before dropping them into a mesh bag (or wire suet cage). Hang your feeders from tree branches at least 5 to 6 feet off the ground. You may also want to try smearing the suet directly on the bark of trees. This will be especially welcome to bird species accustomed to clinging onto bark in search of insects.

One of the things we've not been short of this winter, is water. The fields have been like wet sponges, even our feet have left footprints in the grass.

The ridge and furrow has done its job of channelling water away and down into the ditches

Too much or too little water at different times of the year affect guite dramatically. Too us much and the ground becomes waterlogged and seed can rot, or later the harvested corn needs drying. Too little and the plants don't grow.

There is a "water framework directive" which applies to England and this comprises regulation to protect our waterdrainage, rivers, groundwater

etc and applies to everyonebuilders, industry as well as farmers. Regulating what and how much effluent dan run-off into watercourses.

One of the issues it addresses is nitrates in water- which leach out of farmland in wet weather and consequently, in certain areas where the levels are higher there are 'nitrate vulnerable zones'.

This means there are strict limits as to how much, when, where and at what concentration farmers are allowed to fertilise their arable and grass land and we keep records for this, which can be inspected .

V.A.R. Here to Stay! by Perry Deakin

ell we complained constantly about poor refereeing decisions, we vented into our beer after games when dissecting exactly how our team had managed to lose against 'that lot', we called into radio phone-ins doing exactly the same and lets be frank; we couldn't blame the managers' tactics, couldn't blame the players for lack of effort or ability and couldn't bring ourselves to admit that 'that lot' may just have been the better team on the day there must be another reason we lost today, there just has to be!

And it comes to us in an instant, every single week – THE REFEREE!

'He cost us the game, he hasn't got a clue, he secretly supports 'that lot', he's the worst referee we've ever seen – its his fault!

And so it goes on – every single week at almost every single game we point to a poor refereeing decision as the reason we may have lost, and then the rumble began – quietly at first, even as a whisper until more and more fans, managers, journalists and pundits joined in and it grew into a deafening roar.. 'we need video technology' to ensure referee's don't continue making 'howlers' which cost a team the game! We pointed to Rugby, Cricket and Tennis as shining examples of how technology has almost eradicated the referee/umpire howler and ensured that the correct decisions are made – 'that's what we need in football' we screamed, that will solve the problem!

Football governing bodies around the world, including our own FA and Premier League began trialling various systems at lower level games and tried to work out the best format and match protocol to introduce to the biggest games in the world.... We're not there yet because the V.A.R. (Video Assistant Referee) systems don't seem to have solved all of our problems, who knew!

Firstly, Cricket, Tennis and Rugby matches all have natural breaks in action when a VAR review does not hold up play. Football does not contain these natural breaks and this results in referees having to stop play and await information from VAR control (which is in London by the way and not at the actual game itself) to confirm whether his decision was correct - this is causing incredible frustration for fans and players alike who stand around without any idea whatsoever of what is being discussed, what the issue might be or indeed, why the game has even stopped!

FIFA have recently announced that VAR will be in operation during this summers Wold Cup in Russia so look out for the very regular sight of referees at the worlds largest and most prestigious sports tournament standing in the middle of the pitch with their finger to their ear piece trying to ascertain if that goal can stand, or that red card is appropriate – I predict utter confusion because we simply haven't got the system right yet!!

Interestingly, The Premier League are not introducing VAR yet, perhaps their cautious approach is the right one just now!


