Welly Wonders

With the cold weather behind us and the rainy April days ahead of us, this is the time when most of us find out we have a hole in our wellington boot! The one soggy foot walk home after a day out is not the most pleasant experience and can leave you hating that traitorous boot!

Well, rather than throwing the traitor out, why not repurpose them into a useful garden object?

PLAYFUL GARDEN PLANTER



You'll Need:

Scissors Pebbles Newspaper Compost Plants

What You Do:

Puncture or cut some small holes around the base of the boot to allow some drainage. That darn boot was good at letting water in but it might not drain away quickly so just add to the hole problem!

Fill the bottom of the boot with about 3" deep of pebbles, this will help drainage.

Scrunch up some sheets of newspaper and pad out the bottom of the boot on top of the gravel leaving about 6" of space at the top. If you've got short ankle boots you may not need this step.

Fill the rest of the boot with compost to the top. Plant your flowers or grasses in the top of the wellington boot according to the plant instructions and water in well.

Create several colourful planted wellies and line them up near your door or attach them to a fence for height!

BOOTY BIRD HOUSE



You'll Need: Off-cuts of wood Screws Scissors

What You Do:

Cut a 1" hole in the front of each boot that you are using.

Screw each boot from the inside to a plank of wood and attach this shelf to a fence or tree high up where the birds will feel safe from predators.

Attach two sections of wood big enough to shelter the top open part of the boot (approximately $6'' \times 4''$) together at right angles. Cut a piece of wood angled at each end to fit in the larger right angled pieces. Attach to the larger roof part (these pieces will help to keep out wind and rain and help the roof hold on to the top of the boot).

pril is here and spring has sprung – the days are getting longer, the birds are singing, the Bees are buzzing and the trees are opening their leaves. How wonderful after such a cold, late winter!

Our arable fields will receive a dose of fertiliser. Although the land was mucked before sowing, the growing crop needs to be fed in order to vield for us, both in seed and straw. This application will be artificial fertiliser, the main

nutrients being Nitrogen, phosphate and potash in whichever ratio we think our crops need, in consultation with our agronomist.

Potash (potassium) is mined in places like Canada, Russia and China, Phosphate can be obtained from animal manures or crushed rock and nitrogen fertiliser is made from ammonia. Growing crops take much nutrient out of the soil and this needs to be replenished. In this country, we use much less than France and other countries.

Crops need taking care of if they are to supply us, be it as flour or vegetables, with a significant harvest and that includes keeping them pest and weed free.

One way of doing this is to use chemicals, such as Glyphosate, in a highly researched and regulated environment. Using Glyphosate, for example, allows low tillage for conservation, whereas using mechanical tillage destroys habitat for Lapwings and other ground nesting birds and Bees and insects. In fact, almost three guarters of all farmed land is covered by a nutrient management plan - which limits the amount and type of soil nutrient. Soil health is important to all sectors of agriculture and that is one of the reasons why we house our cattle over winter - it stops the ground getting trodden up and the structure of the soil being damaged, which means our grass will grow better to feed our animals.

Marvellous May

hat could be more quintessentially and quirkily English than our traditional May Day celebrations on May the 1st? Chocolate box villages with the friendly gathering of the community and a maypole adorned with vibrant streaming ribbons in the centre of the green.

Well it may surprise you to learn that the earliest May Day celebrations appeared with the Floralia, festival of Flora, the Roman goddess of flowers. The celebration is also associated with the Gaelic Beltane, and was a traditional summer holiday in many European pagan cultures.

Europe became Christianised and the pagan holidays lost religious character. their May Day changed into a popular secular celebration. secular versions The May Day, of observed Europe and North in America, are be best known

for their traditions of dancing around the maypole and crowning the Queen of May. Fading in popularity since the late 20th century is the giving of "May baskets," small baskets of sweets flowers, usually left or anonymously on neighbours' doorsteps.Did you know that different maypole dances result in different ribbon weave patterns around the maypole?

The Barber's Pole

This produces a lovely twisted stripe pattern in one direction around the pole.



The Spider's Web

Not all maypole patterns are tight to the pole, the spider's web forms a tented ribbon canopy reminiscent of a spider's web.



The Plait

This is the most complex maypole dance and involves dancers moving in both directions weaving in and out between each other. It creates a beautiful braided rope like pattern around the pole.

Spring is Here - Really, it is! by Alan Parsons

You might be forgiven for thinking that this is January or February with cold winds, snow and heavy rain for much of the last few weeks. But it is in fact April when, according to the books, new life should be bursting forth in the garden. So how do we combine such terrible weather with our love of gardening?

The trick is to make the most of the dry spells to do the essential work in the garden and prepare ourselves for warmer and drier days. If your garden is anything like my own then the lawn and beds are totally sodden and should not be walked on as it will damage the structure. There is no point in trying to dig over a bed at present, but there are several jobs we can do.

If you are fortunate enough to have a greenhouse or sun house then give it a good spring clean getting rid of all the pests that have overwintered in it, and wipe the glass to let more of the weak spring sunlight in. It is not too late to start seeds of tomatoes and many brassicas for planting out when the weather improves, and if you have spring cabbages in the ground then a feed with a high nitrogen fertiliser will give them a lift.

This is the time of year that many vegetables that you have grown from seed, including potatoes that have chitted, would normally be put into the ground. However, wait if you can until the water has drained away, and the weather has warmed a bit, or they may just rot. It is always a judgement call as to when to plant out, but in general late planted crops will catch up and often overtake those planted in cold wet conditions.



One thing that you can try, especially if you have limited space, is a herb ladder. You can buy these (or if you are handy make one out of decking) and they are ideal for herbs and flowers plus hardening off trays of produce before they are planted out. Put one against a sunny wall and it will make an attractive addition to your garden.

If you have an allotment or a vegetable area in your garden then a covering of horticultural fleece, or black plastic if it is not too wet, will help the ground to warm up and will also keep the weeds at bay.

Finally, don't forget our feathered friends. The birds in our garden get through a lot of seeds from our feeders each day, but I consider it an investment as they will then be around to feed on the caterpillars and insect pests we will get when the weather warms up.

So, do not despair! Warmer weather will certainly come, we can take this time to prepare for better days.
