As they say, too much of a good thing...

Banana Pops

You'll need:

- ripe bananas
- dark, milk or white chocolate
- colourful sprinkles
- chopped nuts
- fruit yogurts
- wooden lollypop sticks
- greaseproof paper
- a baking tray
- space in your freezer to fit the tray!

Method:

- Cover your baking tray with a piece of greaseproof paper.
- Cut your banana in half and gently insert a lollypop stick into each cut end. Do this with as many bananas as you wish.
- Place each half banana on the baking tray and pop into the freezer for at least 3 hours until the bananas are frozen.

- When the bananas are frozen, melt some chocolate and dip each banana into the melted chocolate, or if you prefer, dip the bananas into fruit yogurt instead.
- Rest each coated banana back on the lined baking tray so that they aren't touching and sprinkle each banana with the topping of your choice, sprinkles or nuts... get really creative.
- Put the tray back into the freezer until the chocolate is set or the yogurt coating is fully frozen.
- When fully frozen, the banana pops can be removed from the tray and stored in the freezer in a ziplock freezer bag to save space.
- Try not to eat too many of these delicious treats! But do enjoy the guilt free feeling when you do!
- TOP TIP: If you want even more dense coverage for your sprikles or nuts, put them in a small cup and when you've dipped the bananas in the chocolate or yogurt, dip them straight into the topping and then rest on the tray.
- **BE INVENTIVE:** If you're feeling adventurous, why not try stacking smaller pieces of bananas with strawberries onto the lollypop stick? Or instead of dipping the bananas drizzle the chocolate on with a spoon.

Baby First Aid

s we head into the summer, a few bumps and scrapes are bound to happen as babies and young children explore the outdoors. It pays to be prepared for any eventuality...

TOP TIPS FOR SAFE **OUTDOORS FUN:**

- · Avoid insects teach your children to leave insects alone and keep footwear on.
- Check your surroundings broken glass, nails, sharp corners can be hidden dangers.
- Drink plenty of water dehydration can be dangerous keep vour children topped up.
- Be water safe never leave a child unattended near water or near a paddling pool.
- Keep a kit always carry

plasters, sting relief ointment, sun-cream, a hat and water with you.

· For anything more serious, it pays to familiarise yourself with baby friendly First Aid.

CHOKING:

1. Slap it out. Lay your baby face down on your thigh and support their head. Give up to five back blows between their shoulder blades with the heel of your

2. Check their mouth. Lay your baby on your thigh face up. Carefully pick out any obvious objects with your fingertips

hand.

3. Squeeze it out. two fingers, give up to five downward chest thrusts. Check the mouth. If the obstruction hasn't cleared call 999/112 for emergency help

4. Call 999/112. Take your baby with you and call 999 or 112. Repeat the above steps 1 to 3 until help arrives.

STOPPED BREATHING:

- 1. Call 999/112 for emergency help. If you're alone, give one minute of CPR before calling on a speaker phone.
- 2. Breathe. Open the airway. Put your lips around their mouth and nose and blow steadily for up to one second. Give five initial rescue breaths.
- 3. Pump. Using two fingers in the centre of the chest, give 30 chest compressions at a rate of 100-120 per minute.
- 4. Repeat. Give two rescue breaths followed by 30 chest compressions. Continue CPR until help arrives.

Read the instructions...
