



Enjoy Your Garden! by Alan Parsons

Summer is here! After a really miserable early Spring with low temperatures and a lot of rain we are now having some cracking weather to enjoy, so let's make the most of it! Things to remember this month...

Watering:

After such a wet couple of months it is easy to forget the watering, not just for plants growing in pots but the flower and vegetable beds as well. Regular watering helps the plants develop and fight off pests, and now is the time to give them a boost by adding a feed to get more flowers and better fruit. Tomatoes in particular need regular watering to help them fruit and stop the fruits splitting.

Pest Control:

The dreaded slugs can cause carnage in the garden in warm wet weather. Many people use slug pellets but if you do please read and follow the instructions. It is common to overdose by adding a ring of blue pellets around the plants. This is not only wrong but unnecessary, as you only need single pellets spaced a few centimetres apart. Ideally we should all try and go green as slug pellets poison birds and hedgehogs. A beer trap is very effective, but my favoured method is to go around in the evening with some tongs and a bucket of hot salty water and dispose of the little beasts that way. If you are spraying plants to get rid of greenfly and white fly this should be done in the late evening to avoid killing the bees. Remember that many insects such as ladybirds and lacewings and also wasps eat many times their own weight in pests, so we should do everything we can to help them by not spraying too much.

Continuous Planting:

If you like to grow your own herbs and fast growing crops such as radishes and lettuce. then planting a few at a time, every week or so, will give you a succession of tasty crops. I find it is hardly worth growing these from seed as the garden centres always have a good range available, and you can purchase just one of two rather than growing too many and having to throw them away. Also they have done the hard work of getting them to germinate and reach a reasonable size to plant out. You can grow a mixture of herbs and salad crops in the same growbag, but do purchase a good quality one and remember to add a regular feed. Some of the cheap growbags have virtually no goodness in them and will need added feed straight away.

Wildlife:

Encouraging wildlife into our gardens gives benefits we can all enjoy. If you have space then it may not be too late to grow sunflowers that birds adore. Why not consider putting up an insect hotel – they look like a bird box with canes in. They will encourage the insects that feed on pets as well as other more interesting ones. We spent several happy hours last year watching leafcutter bees building nests in ours.



But most importantly enjoy your garden and all the pleasures it can bring.



uly already and with it comes lots more work on the farm as all of a

sudden, it seems.

Pollinators (bees, wasps, hover flies. beetles. Butterflies and moths and some mammals, lizards etc) are necessary for 80% of crops and wild flowers. These transfer pollen from one plant to another and mean fertilisation can take place, leading to the formation of seeds and, therefore, the continuation of the species and the farming crop.

Farmers can plant pollen and nectar seed mixes in odd corners of fields to help provide food for pollinators, as many things can have a detrimental effect on them.

Extreme weather or the wrong

sort at the wrong time can mean the right food isn't available when a particular pollinator around and loss is of brownfield sites. planting trees on what was once meadow, house

building, tidiness of gardens and verges all have an adverse effect on pollinating insects etc, as do long distances between areas of pollen rich plants. It is summer, the wild flowers are blooming along the field margins.

Creamy clouds of Meadowsweet wave in the breeze and the Hedge parsley and Chervil dance alongside the hedges. Self heal and Bugles glow bright blue against the green of the grass, while the Loosestrife and Willowherbs stand tall

On hot dry days you may see a wriggle out of the corner of your eye as a grass snake hurries away or come across an Adder basking on a warm stone.

Grass snakes lay eggs, whereas Adders give birth to live young, but both eat small animals, frogs etc.

Or you might spot a Slow worm, which eats slugs and worms. He's really a legless lizard and guite harmless.

Wonders of White Wine

his 3rd August is a day that we here at Local Links hold dear to our hearts. It's White Wine Day! Whether it's straw-yellow, gold, or yellow-green, white wine is a beautiful spectrum of colour!

"The discovery of a wine is of greater moment than the discovery of a constellation. The universe is too full of stars."

~ Benjamin Franklin

The earliest evidence we have of wine indicates that it was being made as early as 7500 years ago in what is now Iran. We are fairly certain that the birth of wine dates a good long while before this, but no archaeological evidence has been able to determine precisely when. What we do know is that ever since its creation it has held a place of high esteem in society, being used in holy rituals and traded among the noble and wealthy. It has been deemed a gift worthy of Kings and Queens, and its vintages have been hoarded in dark cool places like ancient treasures.

White wine comprises the largest percentage of wines

made in Germany and Switzerland, and the northern half of France is also known for its broad variety of white wines. In Catalonia, in fact, there is a special sort of white wine known as Cava. and champagne itself is truly a sparkling white wine that is only produced in the Champagne province France. More recently, the 'New World' have been giving the European producers a run for their money with award winning tipple frequently being produced in California, South Africa, Australia & New Zealand.

At a loss as to the nuanced differences in this refreshing drink? Here's some tips on grapes, where they grow and more importantly, how they taste! Yum!

Cool-Climate Wine

These grapes tend to be thin skinned with low sugar giving an elegant flavour.

Cool climate is generally determined by latitude (think Germany, Chablis and the Willamette Valley), but it can also be the result of elevation, as in the case of what are often referred to as "Alpine"

growing regions like France's Jura and Boca in Northwestern Italy. Cooler-climate growing regions are usually farther away from the equator, with lower temperatures and more seasonal cloud cover.

The Grapes: Chardonnay & Riesling

Warn Clinate Wine Grapes are thick skinned with higher sugars and tend to be full bodied.

Warm-climate wine regions are the regions most folks hit on vacation, and for good reason. The rolling hills of Tuscany, Napa's wide vistas and the beaches of Southern France. In addition to being closer to the equator, warmer-climate regions are often influenced by maritime weather patterns. Their annual temperatures are higher, the sun is stronger and it's usually blue skies all day. The Grapes: Viognier & Malvasia

So pop open a cheeky chilled bottle and celebrate the grape!

So Hot You're Cool



his summer when the temperatures soar, most of us will reach for the ice-creams but consuming cold food may not be the best solution. Eating spicy food makes you sweat, and sweating makes you cool down faster than if you eat cold food. Why not give this easy spicy slow-cooker curry a go!...

Spicy Chicken Curry

Serves 4 **Ingredients:**

1 tbsp. vegetable oil

1 large onion, chopped 3 chicken breasts, diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

1 thumb size piece of ginger (finely chopped)

1 tsp salt

½ tsp ground black pepper

3 tsp hot chilli powder

1 tbsp ground coriander

½ tbsp cumin

1 tbsp curry powder

1 tsp paprika

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 cup chicken stock

1 can chopped tomatoes

2 tbsp tomato puree

2 tsp sugar

1 can coconut milk

Method:

1. Preheat your slow cooker to high. Heat the oil in a large pan, add in the onion and cook on a medium until softened.

2. Add the chicken and cook for 3-4 minutes.

3. Add garlic, ginger, salt, chilli pepper, powder, coriander, ground cumin, curry powder, paprika and cinnamon.

4. Stir to coat the chicken and cook for 1-2 minutes.

5. Add in the stock, tinned tomatoes, tomato puree, sugar and coconut milk.

6. Stir, bring to a gently bubble then pour into your slow cooker and cook for 3-4 hours on high or 5-6 hours on low. 7. Sprinkle with fresh coriander, chopped chillies and serve with rice.

Plan That Playtime

wrapped up in England's World Cup journey over in Russia it is easy to miss or ignore the meltdown currently occurring at Aston Villa, one of the UK's major football clubs with a proud history and countless trophies.

News began to leak about a tax bill which the club had defaulted on and dates being set by HMRC for 'winding up' hearings... surely not?

Not Aston Villa, past league title winners, European cup winners and one of the most recognisable club sides in the world?

To Villa supporters dismay, the leaked news stories proved not only accurate, but were actually only the tip of the iceberg

- the club were in a financial mess and heading for oblivion!

followed News soon confirming Chief that Executive Keith Wyness had been fired and was suing the club for unfair dismissal. then the club's Director of Football, Steve Round was fired and Manager Steve Bruce confirmed that he has been told that selling his best players was necessary if the club were to survive – suddenly the truth began to dawn, Villa were becoming the biggest club in England to have suffered this type of financial meltdown and were in serious trouble.

All of these things and thousands more are inventions made my ingenious inventors that may have lived thousands or hundreds of years ago, or may even still be alive today, that we benefit from every single day. But do we ever take the time to think about just how much out-of-the-box thinking went into inventing these things, or how brave those inventors must have been to dare to dream up and create something nobody had ever heard of before? Probably not! And that's why Inventor's month was...invented! When is it? August, so here we have a look at some unintentional successes!

Penicillin

Fleming's legendary discovery penicillin occurred in 1928, when Fleming left holiday for two-week a leaving out a petri dish containing a staphylococcus culture. This petri dish became contaminated and the contaminating mold had sufficient time to grow, showing signs of combating the staphylococcus culture!

Velcro

Invented by a man named George de Mestral in the 1940's while hunting in the Jura mountains in Switzerland. Mr. de Mestral. a Swiss engineer, realized that the tiny hooks of the cockle-burs were stuck on his pants and in his dog's fur and wondered how they attached themselves. Under the scrutiny of the microscope, he observed the hooks engaging the loops in the fabric of his pants.

Teflon

Discovered by Roy J. Plunkett at the DuPont Company's Jackson Laboratory in 1938, was an accidental invention when a refrigeration experiment went wrong. Plunkett often told student audiences, his mind was prepared by education and training to recognize novelty.

Post-It Notes

In 1968, Dr. Spencer Silver, a scientist at 3M, was

attempting to develop a superstrong adhesive. Instead he accidentally created a "lowtack," reusable, pressuresensitive adhesive. In 1974 a colleague, Art Fry, came up with the idea of using the adhesive to anchor his bookmark in his hymn book.

Microwaves
