# **Body M.O.T.**

e're all guilty of it. Putting it off, finding excuses but we really should take our health more seriously and go for those health checks. really doesn't make sense not to. Finding out if something's wrong sooner rather than later vastly improves our chances for treatment so we're only our own worst enemy by sticking our heads in the sand. Living in a country where we're lucky enough to have free healthcare, we should make the most of it!

# **Over 40 Health Check:**

The NHS Health Check is a health check-up every five years for adults, both men and women, in England aged 40-74. It's designed to spot early signs of stroke, kidney disease, heart disease, type 2 diabetes or dementia. As we get older, we have a higher risk of developing one of these conditions. An NHS Health Check helps find ways to lower this risk

# Prostate Check:

Getting tested doesn't have to be the embarrassing healthcheck that we all imagine! There is a blood test, called a prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test, this measures the level of PSA and may help detect early prostate cancer. Men over 50 can ask for a PSA test from their GP. So, you can keep your pants on for now!

# **Cervical Screening:**

The aim of the NHS Cervical Screening Programme is to reduce the number of women who develop cervical cancer and reduce the number who die from it. Cervical screening isn't a test for cancer, it's a test to check the health of the cells of the cervix. Most changes in the cells, if detected, won't lead to cervical cancer and the cells may go back to normal on their own. But in some cases, the abnormal cells need to be removed so they can't become cancerous. Going for your test every three years is a no-brainer!

# **Breast Cancer Screening:**

About 1 in 8 women in the UK are diagnosed with breast cancer during their lifetime. If it's detected early, treatment is more successful and there's a good chance of recovery. Breast screening aims to find breast cancers early. It uses an X-ray test called a mammogram that can spot cancers when they're too small to see or feel. As the likelihood of getting breast cancer increases with age, all women aged 50 to 70 and registered with a GP are automatically invited for breast cancer screening every 3 years.

# **Bowel Cancer Screening:**

The bowel cancer screening test for people aged 60 or over is a kit you use at home. This is used to check for tiny amounts of blood in your poo. It doesn't diagnose bowel cancer, but it's a simple way to find out if you need further tests. It's also called the faecal occult blood (EOB) test. Sounds like something out of a horror movie but we promise it isn't! All men and women aged 60 to 74 who are registered with a GP in England are automatically sent a bowel cancer screening kit every 2 years. Make sure your GP has the correct address so your kit is posted to the right place.

# **Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm:**

What a mouthful! Otherwise known as AAA screening is a way of checking if there's a bulge or swelling in the aorta, the main blood vessel that runs from your heart down through your tummy. This bulge or swelling is called an abdominal aortic aneurysm. or AAA. It can be serious if it's not spotted early on because it could get bigger and eventually burst (rupture). In England, screening for AAA is offered to men during the year they turn 65. Men aged 65 or over are most at risk of AAAs. Screening can help spot a swelling in the aorta early on when it can be treated.

# Scottish Wildcat

that are less suitable farming. Their for preferred habitat includes woodland and shrubland. The Wildcat was once common throughout all of Britain but they were frequently killed to protect game birds, and considered vermin.

# Water Vole

This adorable little fella is often informally called the water rat, though it only superficially resembles a true rat. Water voles have rounder noses than rats. deep brown fur, chubby faces and

short fuzzy ears (awww!); unlike rats their tails, paws and ears are covered with hair. In the wild, on average, water voles only live about five months.

fter a very hot and dry summer, that has burnt the pasture and meant many farmers are already


feeding the winters fodder to sustain their livestock, the harvest is coming to a close!

Ginny attended the interview with Co-op for a Customer Service vacancy and was not only offered the position, but also offered the role of Head In-Store Baker



# **Black Britain**

ctober sees us welcome British Black History Month. A month where we recognise the struggle for equality that many brave people have campaigned for through out the centuries and still continue to strive for today. Our knowledge is a little sketchy, so we thought we'd look at a few of the key moments!

1833 - Slavery Outlawed

Britain passed an act officially outlawing the institution of slavery. In the space of just 26 years, the British Government outlawed the slave trade that Britain had created and went soon to abolish the practice of slavery throughout the colonies.

# 1913 - First Black Mayor

John Archer became Britain's first black mayor of Battersea. He was also the first black person to hold civic office in Britain as councillor, alderman and then mayor.

1958 - First Black Newspaper

Claudia Jones (born in Trinidad) founded the first major black post-war newspaper "The West Indian Gazette". Claudia was also a political activist and community leader. The Gazette was crucial in her fight for equal opportunities.

1965 - Cy Grant Plays Othello Cy Grant stars as Othello at Leicester's Phoenix Theatre. He was one of the first black presenters on TV and in the late 50s he sang calypso versions of the news on BBC Tonight! 1968 - First Black Headteacher Dr. Beryl Gilroy became London's first black headmaster at Beckford Primary in West Hampstead. She later became a successful novelist, writing stories for and about her students, believing that literature could "heal".

**1968 - Clyde Best** signs for West Ham United. The Bermudan plays 186 games and scores 47 goals in 7 seasons. He was a role model for many black youngsters during the 70s.

# 1973 - News Reporter

Trevor McDonald joins ITN as a reporter from the BBC World Service and becomes Britain's first black TV news reporter. Trevor rose through the ranks and joined the News at Ten. He received an OBE in 1992 and a knighthood in 1999.

## 1987 - UK's First Black MPs

Bernie Grant and Diane Abbott both won seats for Labour in the 1987 General Election. Grant made his mark by wearing a traditional Ghanaian robe. Diane Abbott was active in many political areas. She's still MP for Hackney North & Stoke Newington.

1987 - Paul Gilroy released his book There Ain't No Black in the Union Jack. The book looks at racial politics in England. Gilroy accuses British intellectuals and politicians on both sides of the political divide of refusing to take race seriously.

**1993 - Stephen Lawrence** A-Level student Stephen Lawrence is murdered by a group of white men while waiting for a bus in Eltham, South-East London. Failure to capture his killers provoked his parents to begin a campaign to shame the authorities. No-one has been convicted.

1993 - England Captain

Paul Ince becomes the first black Captain of the England football team. He captained the squad for a total of seven games. Sol Campbell is the other black player who was captain in 1998.

# 1998 - Justin Fashanu Dies

Footballer Justin Fashanu dies. The elder brother of John, he was one of the first British sportsmen to be openly gay. In the 1080s he was the first black player transferred for £1million, yet after coming out his career fell apart.

# 2017 - Record Number of Minority MP's

The general election of 1987 saw the "Famous Four" of BAME MPs; Diane Abbott, Bernie Grant, Keith Vaz and Paul Boating elected into Parliament. 30 years later the 2017 General Election resulted in a new record of 52 BAME (Black, Asian & Minority Ethnic)

that is safe to say virtually anyone can take photographs nowadays. Whether you use a cheap smart phone or a high end digital camera there is a device out there to suit your pocket and your needs. Gone are the days when you might use one film a year on holiday, have it developed at the chemist, then put the prints in a drawer - quite often to be forgotten. Now we can take photos on our phones of life's special events, birthdays and holidays, children growing up or ourselves at a big sporting event and then access them at anytime to show our friends and family using the same phone we took the image on. Photography has never been more accessible.

For many people that is as far as they wish to take their photography, which is fair enough, but there is so much more that can be achieved if you invest some time to take it to a higher level, and that does not mean spending a lot of money on equipment either.

Over the last couple of years I have helped to organise a photography competition aimed at schools. The students first attempts were, it had to be said, pretty poor, with bad composition and little thought given to what they were doing. After giving them some basic advice on how to compose an image and what they needed to think about when taking a photo, their entries improved immensely. When looking at a photograph I sometimes judge it on the basis of would I be happy to have that as a wall calendar for a month, and on that basis many of the student's photos would have passed.

A good photographer will have a "photographers eye" and will know instinctively what makes a good image. Some are fortunate enough to be born with it, but if not a lot of the skills can be learned. and the best way to do that is to get along to your local photographic club and see what others do.

Many clubs encourage members to go for internal competitions. The idea of having critique others your work may sound terrifying but it is always done in constructive way, and you do learn a lot from it, and even if you do not

wish to put in entries yourself you will learn from the talks and critiques of others.

Photographic The Burton Society is a very friendly club which meets every Thursday evening at the Priory Centre in Stretton from early September to May. Beginners are encouraged and for more photographers experienced there are intermediate and advanced groups. Talks each week and competitions throughout the year will help improve your critical skills and help you get more from taking photographs.
