# **Stuffed with Stuffing**

et's face it... there's little more delicious on the Christmas dinner plate than a really good stuffing! Who doesn't like to cook far too much and eat it in sandwiches on boxing day? The herby, stodgy crispy edged goodness is always a delight to pick at between festive chocolates and mince pies!

If you will be feeding others this year, we've found a brilliant vegan friendly recipe that vegetarians will love too!

# For the Vegans & Vegetarians!

# **Ingredients:**

1 tbsp oil 1 small onion, diced 1 small red onion, diced 3 cloves garlic, minced 300 g mushrooms 1/4 tsp dried thyme 1/4 tsp dried oregano 1/2 tsp dried sage 180 g cooked and peeled chestnuts, e.g. tinned vacuum-packed 100 g wholemeal bread (~ 2 inch thick slice of a large loaf) Small bunch fresh parsley Salt

# Method:

Black pepper

- Preheat the oven to 190°C (Gas Mark 5 / 375°F).
- Heat the oil in a frying pan, and add the diced onions, garlic and mushrooms. Cook over a medium heat for about

5 minutes, until the vegetables are soft and any excess liquid has evaporated.

- Transfer the vegetables to a food processor, along with the remaining ingredients. Season generously, and blitz until the mixture just comes together.
- Transfer the stuffing mixture to a baking dish, and bake for around 40 minutes, until crispy on top. Serve warm.

# For the Meat Eaters!

# **Ingredients:**

1 onion, very finely chopped 25g butter 1 garlic clove, crushed 100g fresh white breadcrumbs 1kg sausage meat 1 large apple, peeled, cored & finely chopped Large handful fresh parsley, finely chopped Small handful fresh sage, finely chopped 1 egg, beaten (optional, it makes for a less crumbly stuffing, so add to your own

# Method:

preference)

Salt & pepper

- Fry the onion gently in a small knob of butter until just tender, approx. 10 mins.
- Put the onion, garlic and breadcrumbs in a large bowl. Add 75ml water and use your hands to mix it together. Mix in the sausage meat,

apple, parsley, sage and some salt and pepper to season.

- Mix in the beaten egg if you prefer a less crumbly stuffing.
- Spread into a lightly greased baking dish, cover with foil and cook at 190°C/Gas 5 for 30 minutes, then uncover and cook for a further 10 minutes or so, until slightly crunchy on top.

Alternatively, you can cook both these recipes by rolling a spoonful into balls and baking on a baking sheet sprayed lightly with oil. Cook for 20 minutes and then check every five until cooked through. Cooking this way will give much more crispy surface area.

ecember already and after such a wet couple of months, please let it be dry!

All over the country, farmers have struggled to harvest maize and potato crops, to work and resow fields and some still have seed corn and fertiliser in store, with the financial impact that that carries. Machinery has been stuck axle deep in sludge filled fields, whilst river side pasture has been swamped.

Whilst brexit uncertainty continues, we are having an election - so what do our prospective MPs think of food? They give lip service to maintaining our high standards to win votes, but do they mean

it when it comes to forming trade deals? So why want high standards over here if vou're not bothered about the standards of what you bring in? The Government could end up pricing our own industry and workforce out of the market completely, with unrealistic pricing demands.

This year we've not seen as many Lapwings or Skylarks, which usually nest on our fields - and only two partridge chicks (which we only saw for a few days) - we grow a cover crop to provide food and habitat for such birds and animals all year round. But we have seen many more predators both in the sky (such as Buzzards/ Sparrowhawks) and on the ground (Stoat/foxes/badgers).

Marketing our lambs continues and Ted has an increase in his workload at this time of year- fetching them in for us to weigh and check weekly before taking them back and then bringing those in we have kept to one side when we want to load up.

Consequently he is always pretty well mucked up and, although I make him wait to be let in, he always manages to shake in the kitchen - the paintwork and furniture has what resembles a Pollock-style look about them, as do our clothes if we're too near him when he does!

# **Festive Feasting**

he temptation of Christmas dinner is too much for most of us to resist and an overstuffed stomach makes for a miserable few hours.

While you wait for your gastrointestinal system to work its magic and digest the food, you can take some simple steps to ease your stomach discomfort.

# **Loosen Things Up**

When your stomach is stretched from an overabundance of food and drink, you can ease the pressure by removing anything constricting your belly from the outside. Remove anything that is squeezing you around your middle, such as a belt, tight-fitting trousers or shapewear. If possible, change into some comfy pants, a nightshirt or other loose-fitting clothing until your stomach feels better.

# Let the Gas Out

When you eat a super-sized meal, you typically swallow quite a bit of air as well. So if you feel the urge to belch, go ahead and do it — assuming you're in a situation wherein doing so wouldn't be an embarrassing social faux pas.

Allowing gas to escape your stomach helps reduce the internal pressure and uncomfortable stretching. It's easiest to belch when you're in an upright position as the gas tends to rise to the top of your stomach where you can then easily expel it through your oesophagus.

# Go for a Walk

While you likely feel like parking yourself on the couch or taking a nap after eating too much, you will likely feel much better if you go for a nice long walk instead. Walking helps move food out of your stomach and through your intestines more quickly. It also helps relieve heartburn, which frequently accompanies stomach discomfort when you have overeaten. Walking offers the bonus benefit of helping reduce the expected rise in blood sugar and triglycerides that occurs after a meal.

# Take a Break From Feasting

When you've stuffed yourself to the point of stomach discomfort, it is time to take a break from eating and drinking for at least a few hours. This gives your stomach a chance to empty. The amount of time needed to completely empty your stomach significantly increases if you have eaten a large amount of high-fat foods. It's best to also eschew smoking and chewing gum to avoid swallowing air, further distending your already bloated stomach. When you feel up to eating again, try sticking to light low-fat fare, such a small bowl of clear soup and a cup of tea or coffee.

# **Consider a Digestive Aid**

You might consider an overthe-counter digestive if your discomfort persists despite trying other measures. Chewing a couple of antacid tablets can help, especially if you are experiencing heartburn as well as stomach discomfort. Products containing bismuth subsalicylate claim to relieve a variety of digestive symptoms that might plague you after eating too much, including indigestion, heartburn and stomach upset. Antigas products that contain simethicone (like Petlatine or Dulcogas) are particularly helpful if you are suffering with a lot of gas and belching along with your stomach discomfort.

# **Are You Dreaming of One?**

The jury is out as to whether we will get white Christmas this year! In the UK, white Christmases were more common from the 1550s to the 1850s, during the Little Ice Age; the last frost fair on the River Thames, however, was in the winter of 1813-14.

Did you know that shift from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar in 1752 also slightly reduced the chance of a white Christmas? The change effectively moved Christmas earlier in the winter

Before 2006, for betting purposes, Met Office a employee was required to record if any snow fell on the London Weather Centre over the 24 hours of Christmas Day; after 2006 computers were used.

An "official" white Christmas is defined by the Met Office as "one snowflake to be observed falling in the 24 hours of 25 December somewhere in the UK", but formerly the snow had to be observed at the Met Office building in London. By the newer measure, over half of all years have white Christmases. with being observed 38 times. A more "traditional" idea of snow-covered ground is less common, however, with only 4 occasions reporting snow on the ground at 9am at more than 40% of weather stations.

Although most places in the UK do tend to see some snow in the winter, it generally falls in January and February. However white Christmases



occur, on average every 6 years.

Christmas 2009 was a white Christmas in some parts of Britain, with thick lying snow which easterly winds had brought over the previous week. Travel over much of Britain was badly affected by ice and snow on roads, and was made more slippery by partial daytime thaw followed by overnight refreezing. It was the first white Christmas anywhere in the United Kingdom since 2004. There was another white Christmas in 2010, it was also the coldest Christmas Day ever recorded.

In the past, the Met Office

used a single location to define a white Christmas - which was the Met Office building in London - but decided to change the definition.

With the increase in betting on where will see a white Christmas, the number of locations have increased and can now include sites such as Buckingham Palace, Belfast (Aldergrove Airport), Aberdeen (Pittodrie Aberdeen FC), Edinburgh (Castle), Coronation Street in Manchester and the Millennium Stadium in Cardiff.

The Met Office analyse data from their observing stations around the UK to provide a complete picture of where snow has fallen or was lying on Christmas Day.

According to the weather forecasters, the last widespread white Christmas in the UK was in 2010. This was an extremely unusual one, as not only was there snow on the ground at 83% of stations (the highest amount ever recorded) but snow or sleet also fell at 19% of stations.

2015 was also "technically a white Christmas" in the UK with 10% of weather stations recording snow falling. However, no-one reported any snow lying on the ground.

Here's hoping we get one for 2019!



# Wenceslas Who?

ne of our favourite Christmas carols is a story of a King with a rather peculiar name. We were curious as to who this King was and how the carol came about, so we thought we'd have a look!

'Good King Wenceslas' is a Christmas carol that tells a story of a Bohemian king going on a journey and braving harsh winter weather to give alms to a poor peasant on the Feast of Stephen (December 26, the Second Day of Christmas also know in the UK as Boxing Day). During the journey, his page is about to give up the struggle against the cold weather, but is enabled to continue by following the king's footprints, step for step, through the deep snow.

The legend is based on the life of the historical Saint Wenceslaus I, Duke of Bohemia or Svatý Václav in the now Czech Republic who lived between 907–935 AD. The name Wenceslas is a Latinised version of the old Czech language "Venceslav".

In 1853, English hymnwriter John Mason Neale wrote the "Wenceslas" lyrics, in collaboration with his music editor Thomas Helmore, and the carol first appeared in Carols for Christmas-Tide, published by Novello & Co in 1853. Neale's lyrics were set to the melody of a 13th-century spring carol "Tempus adest floridum" ("The time is near for flowering") first published in 1582.

Wenceslas was considered martyr and a saint immediately after his death in the 10th century, when a cult of Wenceslas rose up in Bohemia and in England. Although Wenceslas during his lifetime, only duke, Holy Roman Emperor Otto I (962–973) posthumously "conferred on him the regal dignity and title and that is why, in the legend and song, he is referred to as a "king".

Wenceslas is not to be confused with King Wenceslaus I of Bohemia (Wenceslaus I Premyslid), who lived more than three centuries later.

With lyrics that embody all that's wonderful about the spirit of Christmas, whether you are of any world faith or of none, be sure to take the story and sentiment of looking after those less fortunate with you into 2020!

'Good King Wenceslas looked out, on the Feast of Stephen, When the snow lay round about, deep and crisp and even:

Brightly shone the moon that night, tho' the frost was cruel, When a poor man came in sight, gath'ring winter fuel.

"Hither, page, and stand by me, if thou know'st it, telling, Yonder peasant, who is he? Where and what his dwelling?"

"Sire, he lives a good league hence, underneath the mountain:

Right against the forest fence, by Saint Agnes' fountain."

"Bring me flesh, and bring me wine, bring me pine logs hither:

Thou and I shall see him dine, when we bear them thither."
Page and monarch, forth they went, forth they went together;

Through the rude wind's wild lament and the bitter weather. "Sire, the night is darker now, and the wind blows stronger; Fails my heart, I know not how; I can go no longer."

"Mark my footsteps, good my page. Tread thou in them boldly

Thou shalt find the winter's rage freeze thy blood less coldly."

In his master's steps he trod, where the snow lay dinted; Heat was in the very sod which the saint had printed. Therefore, Christian men,

be sure, wealth or rank possessing,

# 'Twas The Night Before Christmas

was the night before Christmas and all through the house, not one of us knew how this story came about! Loved by familie up and down the UK you might be surprised to know that the story originated in America and fundamentally changed how we thought Santa Claus goes about his business!

The poem originally titled "A Visit from St. Nicholas" was first published anonymously in 1823. The poem has been called arguably the bestknown verses ever written by an American and is largely responsible for some of the conceptions of Santa Claus mid-nineteenth the century to today. It has had a massive impact on the history Christmas gift-giving. of Before the poem gained wide popularity, American ideas had varied considerably about Saint Nicholas and other Christmastide visitors.

The authorship of "A Visit" is credited to Clement Clarke Moore who is said to have composed it on a snowy winter's day during a trip on a sleigh. His inspiration

for the character of Saint Nicholas was a local Dutch handyman as well as the historical Saint Nicholas. Moore originated many of the features that are still associated with Santa Claus today while borrowing other such as the use of reindeer. The poem was first published anonymously in the Troy, New York Sentinel on 23 December 1823, having been sent there by a friend of Moore and was reprinted frequently thereafter with no name attached. It was first attributed in print to Moore in 1837.

Moore had a reputation as an erudite professor and had not wished at first to be connected with the unscholarly verse. He eventually included it in his own published works at the insistence of his children, for whom he had originally written the piece.

Moore's conception of Saint Nicholas was borrowed from his friend Washington Irving, but Moore portrayed his "jolly old elf" as arriving on Christmas Eve rather than Christmas Day. At the time that Moore wrote the poem, Christmas Day was overtaking New Year's Day as the preferred genteel family holiday of the season, but some Protestants

viewed Christmas as the result of "Catholic ignorance and deception" and still had reservations. By having Saint Nicholas arrive the night before, Moore deftly shifted the focus away from Christmas Day with its still "problematic" religious associations. As a result, "New Yorkers embraced Moore's child-centered version of Christmas as if they had been doing it all their lives."

Modern printings frequently incorporate alterations that reflect changing linguistic cultural sensibilities. For example, breast in "The moon on the breast of the new-fallen snow" is frequently bowdlerized to crest; archaic ere in "But I heard him exclaim ere he drove out of sight" is frequently replaced with as. This change implies that Santa Claus made exclamation the moment at he disappeared from view, while the exclamation came before his disappearance in the original. "Happy Christmas to all, and to all a good-night" is frequently rendered with the traditional English locution "Merry Christmas".

# Winter Grooming for Your Dog

You may think that during the winter it is best to let your dog's hair grow long and thick to keep them warm and to stop them from feeling the winter chill, however grooming couldn't be more important than at this time of year.

Whilst out walking with your 4-legged friend this winter you need to be aware of what the weather conditions can do to their paws and coat. Wet and rainy weather can result in long, wet and matted fur. Grit/salt on the roads and icy conditions can leave your dog's paws full of little ice balls coupled with the grit and anything else they might pick up along the way. All of this can easily lead to a cold, wet and infection-susceptible dog.

While it's true that double-coated breeds and others with thick, long fur are more 'winterready' than short haired dogs, the 'blessing' of these thick coats in winter can guickly become a curse if the coat isn't maintained in a healthy condition.

Fur that's matted doesn't insulate or provide warmth; instead, it provides discomfort, pain and hot spots. Matting can even lead to infections below the skin, so when considering the effects of less frequent grooming, consider how your dog's health may be affected as a result. Grooming isn't just to make your dog look beautiful it also crucial to your dog's good health.


# So, what can you do?

It isn't all bad, there are things you can do to keep your dog and their coat well maintained and it's quite easy to do:

Rinse Paws – after those long walks simply rinse your dog's paws with a bowl of warm water and towel dry to ensure there are no hidden nasties between the pads.



- Brush give your dog's coat a dry with a towel or blow dryer (on low heat) followed by a thorough brush through.
- Keep Dry If you bathe your dog at home always ensure they are properly dried before going outside as they can get chills just like you, just imagine going out in the icy cold weather with wet hair... not fun!
- Regular Grooming Schedule Ensure you continue to visit your groomer every 6-8 weeks to have a good all over groom, including getting those pads trimmed. Removing hair from the pads can help to stop unwanted bits clinging in between them and stop icy cold water getting soaked in. Keeping your dog's coat at a more manageable length will make it easier for you to stick to a routine and keep them matt free.
