Hot Stuff!

any of us have taken enjoying outdoors, whether it's short walks from the home or longer rambles in countryside, getting some fresh air has been worthwhile. As the colder weather sets in. there's reason no discontinue stretching your legs and headspace, just fill a flask with something warm and head on out! But if you're weary of tea or coffee, and now that the festive season is nogu us, why not something a little different or a touch more decadent!

Mulled Apple Drink

We're sure many of you have tried this as an alternative to mulled wine but try this recipe that uses apple juice instead of cider so that it's suitable for children and designated drivers. You can always make the 'adult version' by adding a splash of brandy or rum!

Ingredients (serves 4-5)

2 cinammon sticks

4 allspice berries (or pinch of ground allspice)

4 whole cloves (or pinch of ground cloves)

Peel from 1 orange

Peel from 1 lemon

2 tbsp maple syrup 1 litre of apple juice

Method: Put the cinammon sticks, cloves, allspice, orange peel and lemon peel into a large sauce pan. Add the maple syrup and apple juice then heat until almost at

boiling. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 30 minutes. Serve in a mug and add a splash or rum for the grownups!



Peppermint Mocha Chocolate

Try this very decadent hot chocolate recipe. The coffee and the mint schnapps will certainly put a spring in your step! This could be adpated for children by leaving out the schnapps and substituting the milk chocolate for mint chocoloate to keep the minty flavour.

Ingredients (serves 1-2)

1 cup of milk1 tsp of coffee50g dark chocolate25g milk chocolateA splash of mint schnappsWhipped creamCrushed candy canes

Method: Heat the milk in a sacuepan over a low heat. Add the coffee and both types of chocolate. Whisk until everything is melted and combined. Remove from heat and stir in the schnapps. Serve in mugs topped with whipped cream and a sprinkle of crushed candy canes. Absolutely delicious!

Modern Hot Toddy

According to legend, the Hot Toddy originated on the damp streets of Edinburgh, mixing whiskey with hot water and spices, with the water said to come from Tod's Well, hence the name. It's origin is also said to be traced back to British-occupied India and the Hindi word "taddy", referring to a fermented drink made from palm sap, originating from the 1600s!

Whatever the true history there is no doubting that when the cold weather demands a stiff drink, this one is hard to beat. Try this very modern twist on a classic drink!

Ingredients (serves 1)


2-3 cardamon pods
1 tsp butter
2-3 slices of fresh ginger
1 tsp brown sugar
Pinch of orange zest
Pinch of nutmeg
Vanilla essence
1 measure of whiskey
Hot water

Method: Add the dry ingredients (including the butter) to a mug. Mix the whiskey and hot water then pour over the spices etc. Mix well and serve with a cinnamon stick and a drop of vanilla essence.



Christmas Turkey

ith UK turkey farmers talking of difficulty of fulfilling Christmas orders due to Covidrelated staff shortages, or turkeys being too large for many families in the UK facing the possibility of a more modest celebration this year. due to restrictions on gathering numbers under current rules, it might be time to look at alternatives to the traditional turkey roast or to look at some creative ways of making the most of the inevitable turkey leftovers.



Lemon Turkey Soup Something a little lighter after Christmas Day excess!

Ingredients (4 people)Olive oil

1 red onion, chopped 1 garlic clove, minced 1-2 carrots, thinly sliced 1 stick of celery, chopped 1/2 red pepper, diced 500ml chicken stock
250g cooked turkey, chopped
2 tbsp lemon juice
2 tsp lemon zest
Handful of spinach leaves
Salt and pepper

Method: eat oil in a large pan on medium heat. Cook onion and garlic for a couple of minutes until fragrant. Add carrots, celery, pepper: cook until carrots start to soften.

Add chicken stock to the pan and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 20-30 minutes.

Stir in the chopped turkey, lemon juice, lemon zest, spinach leaves and simmer until spinach is wilted. Season with salt and pepper and serve.



Turkey PaellaTry this take on a Spanish classic.

Ingredients

100g chorizo, chopped 1 onion, chopped 2 cloves garlic, chopped 1 green pepper, chopped 250g white rice 1 can chopped tomatoes 1/2 tsp saffron 1 tsp smoked paprika 250g cooked turkey 1 tbsp chopped parsley 100ml white wine 1 litre chicken stock

Method: In a large pan, fry the chorizo in oil until coloured. Add onions and pepper and cook for 5 minutes. Add garlic, paprika, salt, pepper and the saffron. Add the rice and cook for a couple of minutes until coated with the cooking oil. Add the wine and cook until almost evaporated. Add the turkey, tomatoes and half of the chicken stock. Cover and cook for 10 minutes. If it gets Continue cooking until rice is just tender, 20-30 mins. Serve and sprinkle with the chopped parsley and lemon wedges.

Or if you fancy, dispense with the turkey this year and try an alternative bird:

Pheasant, Grouse, Duck, or a Partridge or a Pidgeon per person looks like a feast treat!

nder lockdown, unlike so many in cities across the UK, we are so lucky to live where we do! The beautiful English countryside, particularly here in Derbyshire, has never been so appreciated by us and those that live nearby.

Whilst we welcome anyone exercising or just enjoying a ramble on our many footpaths, it is important that notice is taken of the countryside codegates left as they are found, litter taken home, care taken when near livestock and not allowing dogs to roam too freely (disturbing and displacing wildlife) and please be aware you are walking through someone's home and workplace.

December is a mixed monthshort days, dark nights and cold, bleak, dreary weather and we are bringing in our remaining cattle, to pass the next few months indoors. Dairy cattle will be in already and cattle are quite happy to be dry, warm and well fed and

watered. Just like us, they won't move far if everything is to hand.

We let ours out into the yards whilst we scrape out and bed and some will jump and skip about, happy to stretch their legs, others have to be pushed out and lurk by the gate, ready to come in at any opportunity. We also take the chance to check water troughs electrics when they're out of the way.

It's a fallacy often promoted by single agenda groups, that farmers do not care about the welfare of their animals. Of course there are those who don't (as in society as a whole) but mostly, our livestock is treated fairly and sensitively and the UK ranks as one of the only four countries world wide reaching the highest grade for commitments to animal welfare. There is also a strong legal framework alongside assurance initiatives.

We have put the rams in with the ewe flock and they have been on fresh pasture to make sure they've had enough nutrition for their pregnancies. Last years lambs have been sold in batches through the livestock market, but we still have guite a number left.

The question is do we sell all as quickly as possible, because of brexit (at the time of writing no trade deal with the EU, our largest customer has been done and there is no 'third country' legislation in place either for imports/exports), or do we keep them and assume everything will be sorted?

Luckily over a million people lobbied to make sure there was trade and standards commission in place to scrutinise deals on the agriculture sector's behalf. showing consumers do care how their food is produced.

Our fields are full of wheeling crows and pigeons and field fares chatter as they swoop and settle then lift and swirl around to land again further along. The plaintive cry of a young buzzard as he flaps clumsily after his parents echoes eerily and sparrows argue as they feast hedgerow fare of hips, haws and left over sloes.

Wishing you good Christmas. whatever vour circumstances for what the year ahead brings.

Here are some of Rose's wrapping tips to ensure you get the perfect wrap, every time.

The quality of the wrapping paper is EVERYTHING. There might be a lot of cheap paper around to tempt you, but poorquality paper can tear easily, and is therefore a false economy. But you don't need

to go overboard. Brown parcel paper is always a good choice and leaves you with plenty of scope for artistic licence – with ribbons, felt tip pens and colourful gift tags.

Layered tissue paper can also surprisingly
• strong and flexible – ideal for wrapping soft gifts such as cuddly toys.

Never trust your instincts. You need to be absolutely sure the paper you are working with is the right size. There's nothing more frustrating than working with a piece of wrapping paper that doesn't quite meet in the middle!

Place the gift in the middle of your wrapping paper. Make sure that the paper will cross with room to spare, over the largest part of the gift. Err on the side of generosity – always! You can cut back, if necessary.

Preparation is key! Use a table (not the floor, particularly a carpeted one). Make sure you have all the tools you might need to hand and within easy grasp including sharp scissors. A

steel ruler will tear paper with great accuracy and a sharp edge.

Find a box! As we all know, wrapping stuff with straight edges is so much easier and neater. So always keep things like shoe boxes to accommodate particularly awkward shapes.

Double sided tape will add a professional touch. And always double fold the paper to create a neat, straight edge before applying the tape.

Use your fingernail along a fold line to create a sharp edge

Put on some Christmas music. There's nothing like a good Christmas classic to get you in the mood for a wrap.

Christmas Top Tips by Robert Woodward BvetMed MRCVS

e at Scarsdale Vets want Christmas to be not only a happy and enjoyable time for you and your family, but also for your household pets. Here are some top tips to keep your pets safe and content this holiday:

Secure your Christmas tree

Christmas trees are a seasonal favourite but can pose hazards to pets. Firstly make sure that your tree is secure so that it can't be easily pulled over. Also try to hide or cover electricity cables for Christmas lights so that they are not easily accessible to chew. Food items should also not be left beneath the tree that animals could eat.

Amazingly we do see the odd animal every year with pine needles stuck in their foot causing irritation or infection. For this reason it is recommended to keep the floor around the tree clear of needles and restrict access of pets to the room where the Christmas tree is kept.

Keep Christmas decorations away from pets

Decorations are lovely but should always be placed away from easy access to animals. Ribbons or tinsel when ingested can cause gut obstructions. Mistletoe is also poisonous when eaten or chewed.

Give your pet the right treat

Of course it is fine to give your pet the occasional treat, so long as it is not given in such amounts as to replace their daily diet. Small bits of chicken or turkey are fine and generally well tolerated by many healthy animals. If your pet is on a prescription diet even have recipe's available for you to make your own treats out of their food.....please feel free to contact the surgery for more details.

Chocolate, some nuts and dried fruit (raisins, sultanas and currants) should all be avoided as they can prove very toxic to dogs.

Give your pet space to relax

Christmas can be a stressful period not only for us adults, but also for our pets. The sudden influx of visitors and increased attention can be overwhelming. Here giving your pet a space to escape away from activity can be a real help to relieve stress. Pheromone sprays or diffusers are also available to promote a calming environment for dogs and cats. Spice Up Your Life!

ot just for adding to curry recipes, spices play a key part in many of the well-known tastes of Christmas: from mulled wine to adding an extra taste to your ham joint.

theory is that the One Crusaders brought back the idea of using Spices in food and associated it with the celebration of Christ since he was born in modern day Palestine. It also helped to firmly establish Christmas as a Christian holiday, replacing the pagan Sol Invictus. Another theory is that the strong smell and taste of spices helped to mask the taste of meat that was past its best!

Many spices also have natural medicinal properties. We take a look at the four most used spices at Christmas.

Allspice

Despite it's name, Allspice isn't a mixture of many spices it's actually a single spice. It's Caribbean in origin and is the dried berry of the Pimenta Diocia tree, a relative of Myrtle. It was the English who gave it the name Allspice when it was discovered in the 1600s due to it tasting similar to a combination of cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg.

Allspice can be used in both sweet and savoury dishes but it's perhaps best known in Caribbean/Jamaican 'jerk seasoning'. It also has many

medicinal properties with many folk medicines using it as a key ingredient. It's often used to treat colic, stomach upsets and for general pain relief.

Cloves

Cloves are a very pungent spice made from the flower buds of an evergreen tree called, appropriately, The Clove Tree!

The dried buds are shaped like a small reddish-brown spike and they can be used whole or ground. Ground cloves are very pungent so be careful with the amount you use in recipes!

Cloves are grown in India, Madagascar and Indonesia. At one time, the trade in Cloves was so lucrative in the Spice Islands that in 1667, following the Second Anglo-Dutch War, the British relinquished the Spice Islands to the Dutch in exchange for New Amsterdam, which is now known as Manhattan Island!

As well as being used in many sweet and savoury recipes, the essential oil from Cloves is very commonly used in aromatherapy for stress relief. Cloves are often used in Indian and Chinese medicine as a warming and stimulating substance.

Cinnamon

True Cinnamon dates back to Chinese writings in 2800 B.C and is native to Ceylon (Sri Lanka). So prized, centuries ago it was said to be worth fifteen times the same weight in silver!

As well as a key flavour for many sweet and savoury Cinnamon cuisines. widely used by doctors and medieval physicians. spice was also valued for it's preservative qualities for meat - the phenols it contains inhibit bacteria responsible spoilage, with the added bonus that the strong aroma masked the stench of aged meats. The Egyptians also used it in their embalming process!

Ginger

Ginger is the root of the giner plant Zingiber Officiale and belongs to the same family as turmeric and cardamom. It's widely available in different forms: fresh, dried, pickled, preserved, candied and powdered and is easily used in sweet and savoury cooking. The taste of fresh ginger compared to powdered ginger is very different and is not easily exchanged in recipes.

Ginger also has many health benefits especially stomach upsets or gastrointenstinal problems. There is also scientific evidence that it can help control nausea, reduce pain and improve joint function for people with arthritis and is a natural antibacterial.
