





Spring Spruce Up

utting back the trees in your garden can be a satisfying and beneficial job, but you need to know what you're doing. It's a matter of knowing what to cut, how much to simply trim and when to take to the saw.

Benefits of Trimming

There are a number of benefits to properly trimming the trees in your garden. Proper pruning improves the health of your trees by removing dead or dying branches. It also protects the branch structure and reduces hazards such as falling limbs or low-hanging branches. On fruit trees, it can improve the size and quantity of the crop. In a garden, a lone tree can develop a broad or weak structure and die prematurely.

How To Prune

All cuts on live branches should be as close to the trunk or parent limb as possible. Also, the bark at the edge of all pruning cuts should remain firmly attached. Any branch that is too large to support with one hand should be cut in stages to avoid splitting or tearing of bark. Ropes should be used to lower large branches to the ground.

Timing

Different trees should be pruned at different times of the year. For example, pruning summer blooming trees in early spring before they get their new growth, while fruit trees should be pruned in late winter for shape and to expose the centre of trees to light. Trees and shrubs that should be pruned now include:

- Witch Hazels
- Forsythia All types right after flowering.
- Jasminum nudiflorum the Yellow Winter flowering type. Kerria japonica - right after flowering, and cut some of the branches down to near ground level.
- Pieris. Especially if there was frost damage to the new foliage.
- Quince As soon as flowering finished.
- Salix caprea and others that are grown for their pussy willow catkins.
- Fatsia japonica is best pruned in late April - May once frosts are over.
- Deciduous Winter Flowering Viburnums.

Safety

There are some basic rules when trimming your own trees.

- Never trim trees from a l a d d e r . Instead, secure yourself to the tree from at least two points.
- Never climb with cutting tools in hand.
- Always wear a hardhat

and safety glasses.

• Most of all, leave the difficult or hard-to-reach work to the professionals.

Four Classes of Pruning...

Fine Pruning:

Small, premium cutting that improves tree's aesthetics.

Standard Pruning:

Slightly heavier cutting more devoted to enhancing the tree's branch structure.

Hazard Pruning:

Recommended when there are safety considerations. This usually involves the removal of branches two inches or greater in diameter.

Crown Reduction:

The reduction of the tops and sides of a tree, when there is storm damage or when branches are interfering with lines.

pril arrives and we're creeping slowly back to some sort of normality, at last! The hedges and trees are beginning to come into leaf.

The grass fields are greening up, being fertilised (whether by natural means or by the addition of artificial) and rolled to encourage growth and the fields are growing strongly. Farmers are busy tending to the foods they are cultivating, making decisions based on advice. or experience.

We've also got some Spring field work to do- ploughing up some over wintered stubble and working down and sowing.

We are lambing this monthoutside during the day and inside at night, the ewes soon get into the routine. It also means we can keep them inside if the weather takes a turn for the worst (which it can still easily do).

Any lambs born outside are brought into an individual pen, where they can be kept an eye on, before being turned out the again into nurserv paddock.

With some of last years lambs still on farm, we have been feeding them over the last few weeks (to make up for the lack of grass growth) and are hoping to take them to market as soon as they are ready.

Other farmers will be Spring calving, but ours don't calve until June. They were turned out at the end of March, after our six monthly Btb test. Our home bred bull did enjoy a romp in a field briefly early in March when he managed to slip through a gate(my fault!) when we were mucking out his shed, but he soon wanted to come back in when he realised I'd stopped his ladies from joining him!

Our Red Tractor assurance status means that everything has to be recorded and that means I have

to regularly make time to update all my records. But it means that the customer can have complete trust in what they buy if the product carries the little Red Tractor recognised by 50% consumers(the highest of any assurance marque).

As the weather warms up one of the first butterflies out and about may be the Comma, it's larva feeding on nettleslooking like it's had its wings crimped and maybe even a little bit moth eaten if it is an over wintered adult.

And, at last, we will see the return of the Swallows and House martins, coming back to the same old nesting sites they were raised in what becomes of them if their stables and sheds converted?) and then we know that Spring is well and truly here!

May Merriment

ever wondered why we have a Bank Holiday at the beginning of May? Well it's a historical celebration called May Day! Traditionally, May Day is celebrated on 1 May, but in the UK the bank holiday is held on the first Monday of the month. And while for many, May Day is simply associated with the chance to have a lie-in, it actually has a long tradition of political protest.

May Day Protests

In the UK, May Day has become linked to International Workers' Day, known as Labour Day in some countries.

This is a celebration of labourers and the working classes, and in recent years has seen large-scale protests in including London, cities Glasgow and Edinburgh.

The History Of May Day

May Day has roots in pagan tradition celebrating spring, firstly Floralia, the festival of Flora, the Roman goddess of flowers.

It also has roots in the Gaelic Beltane, celebration of marking the beginning of summer.

May Day celebrations were banned in Britain by the Puritan government following the execution of Charles I on 30 January 1649. They were, however, reinstated with the restoration of Charles II in 1660.

A bank holiday was celebrated in Scotland since 1871 but was only introduced in the rest of the UK in 1978 by the thenemployment secretary Michael Foot.

May Day Traditions

In some villages, a maypole is erected with ribbons attached. People, often children of the village, dance around the pole. The symbolism of this tradition is hotly debated, with some suggesting the pole represents the Earth's axis while others claim it is a phallic symbol associated with fertility.

Morris dancers, dressed in costumes traditional and wearing bell pads on their shins, may perform while wielding items such as sticks, swords or handkerchiefs.

Some celebrations may also see a May Queen crowned. Often a young girl wearing white and crowned with flowers, the May Queen may make a speech before leading a procession.

Traditions Around the World

Finland: May Day is a drinking day for the Finnish – adults and students alike. A favorite staple drink is a mead, also known as "Sima."

Germany: Some Germans use chalk to draw a line between their house and their crush's house, linking their destinies forever (or at least until it rains).

Bulgaria: Irminden, is a May tradition where Day Bulgarians steer clear of the fields for fear of snake bites and generally use whatever methods possible to banish reptiles away from them.

Hawaii: A Lei Queen will be chosen on May Day, similar to a May Queen — only she must possess skills of language, lei-making, and general charisma to stand against the opposition.

Italy: In Assisi, people dress up in traditional dress - including swords and shields for the men - and there are a variety of specific activities to participate in. These include horse riding, crossbow competitions and the election of a Madonna Primavera (Queen of Spring). There are also singing competitions, day and night processions, feasts and flower dances to welcome the new spring and the renewed joy of life

Jelly in Your Belly!

id you know that April 22nd is Jelly Bean Day? Jelly beans are rumoured to have appeared during the time of American Civil War. William Schraff, a Boston confectioner, urged his customers to send jelly beans to the soldiers.

Today food historians believe, that the first jelly beans appeared around that time. The very first advertisement of jelly beans appeared on July 5, 1905, in the Chicago Daily News. They were sold for 9 cents per pound. Earlier jelly beans were associated with Easter because of their egg-like shape. However this changed, that is why we can enjoy these candies anytime.

And did you know, that jelly beans were President Reagan's favorite candies and he used them to quit smoking, when he was the governor of California? Each year about 16 billion jelly beans are manufactured in the U.S. just for Easter.

If you line up all jelly beans eaten by folks during Easter holidays, they could circle the Earth for more than 3 times!

If like us and Ronald you're a fan of these tiny sugary delights, why not give these recipes a go!...



Jelly Bean Pop-Tarts

Ingredients:

- Ready-roll pastry
- Jelly beans
- Icing sugar
- Milk
- Rainbow sprinkles

Method:

- Preheat the oven to 230c or 210c in a fan assisted oven.
- Unroll the pastry and cut into 8cm x 12cm making sure you have an even number for tops and bottoms of the tarts.
- Place jelly beans on half the pastry rectangles leaving space at the edges.
- Moisten the edges with milk.
- Place a second pastry rectangle on top of the bean half, press to seal and use a fork to crimp the edges making a firm seal.

- Place each tart on a baking sheet lined with greaseproof paper or baking parchment.
- •Cook in the oven for 7 8 minutes until the edges are slightly golden.
- •Remove from oven and leave to cool slightly.
- •Mix one or two tablespoons of milk into a cup of icing sugar, don't use too much or the icing will be too runny.
- •Spoon onto the tarts and top with rainbow sprinkles.

Top tip!: You can choose a mixture of flavours or if you have time on your hands why not separate out the flavoured beans?

If you are failing at being an adult and starting your day with all that sugar wasn't bad enough, why not try out this boozy bean delight at the end of the day!...

Jelly Bean Vodka

- Separate jelly beans by color and place 4 to 6 jelly beans in the bottom of a medium sized sealable jar.
- Pour in one cup of vodka. Fasten the lid of the jar.
- •Allow vodka to infuse for at least 24 hours. Strain the vodka to rid the infused liquor of larger pieces of jelly beans.







You might be surprised to learn that 600+ years ago, it was a holiday on par with Christmas in the UK. are the most commonly owned pet in UK households. With more and more households choosing to own a dog, the popularity of dogs has sadly led to a rise in dog theft. Fortunately, there are number of preventative steps you can take to reduce the chances of your dog being stolen.

Stay Alert

It's important to be aware of any suspicious behaviour.

- •This could be anyone approaching dog owners to ask them lots of questions about their dog
- •There are reports of thieves leaving chalk or spray paint markings in front of houses they intend to target. If you notice unusual markings, report them
- Keep up to date with online local community groups. These can be particularly useful in identifying unusual behaviour in areas that could raise concern
- Don't hesitate to contact the police by calling 101 if you witness any suspicious behaviour.

Preventative Measures

Even the most basic of security steps can help to reduce the risk of your pet being stolen.

- Avoid leaving your dog unattended outside in a public space or in your car
- •Secure your garden. If you do have a gate, fit a lock
- •Try not to leave your dog unsupervised in the garden
- •Installing security cameras can act as a deterrent. If dog thefts are common in your area, this may be something to consider.

Protecting Your Dog From Dog Theft

- •Ensure that your dog is microchipped. All puppies must be microchipped by 8 weeks of age by law, and definitely before they leave their breeder
- Avoid putting your dog's name on their ID tag
- Take plenty of photos of your dog
- •Make sure your dog is wearing a collar and has an accurate ID tag
- •Keep your contact details updated, if you change your

phone number or move house, be sure to update the information on your dog's ID tag

•Recall training is particularly important. Spend time practicing this and if it's safer, keep your dog on a lead.

What should I do if my dog goes missing?

In the unfortunate event that your dog does go missing, you should report this immediately. Below is a checklist of who you should inform as soon as possible;

- •The Police via 101
- Your neighbours
- •Local community online pages
- Your local council
- •Your vet and other local practices
- •Local animal rescue centres
- •The database with which your dog's microchip is registered.

Mums & Mental Health

ach May the spotlight is shined on Maternal Mental Health with the whole month dedicated to Maternal Mental Health Month.

In late 2015, a small group of people met to start making plans for the first-ever World Maternal Mental Health campaign. This campaign aims to raise awareness of maternal mental health issues so that more women will get treatment and fewer will suffer.

The key messages are:

- Maternal mental health matters.
- •Women, as well as their family and friends, need to know the signs of maternal mental ill-health and that they are not alone!
- •You can find help and support for perinatal mental health problems.

Before long the steering committee had grown to include representatives from around the globe, all with a common goal of increasing awareness of maternal mental health issues.

In many countries, as many as 1 in 5 new mothers experience some type of perinatal mood and anxiety disorder (PMD). These illnesses frequently go unnoticed and untreated, often with tragic and long-term

consequences to mothers, children, and fathers alike.

Sometimes motherhood comes with challenges, emotional upheaval and social isolation. These challenges are neither universal nor isolated, each mother's experience is unique, often balancing home, work and educational life, or recognising that women don't stop being mothers when their children start school or leave home. Here are three top messages to show support to struggling mothers.

Don't be judgemental

No parent is perfect and there's no single definition of what a "good mum" is. We can all support each other by sharing challenges and solutions and by starting to talk more candidly about motherhood, accepting both the highs and the lows. Crucially don't judge - every mother is trying her best.

Support mothers to have some 'me' time

Give her the gift of time so she can continue to enjoy her favourite things. We all need some time to invest in things we find relaxing and enjoyable. Mothers with all the pressures upon them, sometimes need more help.

Create supportive groups

Every mother needs to feel part of a community. Some may need encouragement to join new drop-in groups and others may want to stay connected to old friends as well as family. Groups can be formed around shared experiences, interests, cultures or languages.
