Local Secrets - Anchor Church



nchor Church, also know as Ingleby Hermitage is a series of caves on the banks of the River Trent. Ingleby is situated on the south of the River Trent on a rise between Stanton by Bridge and Repton.

The small series of caves in the sandstone were the homes of hermits. The word Ingleby means Village of the English.

Anchor Church Caves are beside the Old River Trent;

there is a public footpath at the bottom of the crag or at the top when the river floods in winter. The crag is over 100m long and up to 12m high and in a very attractive setting. The main feature is not the crag at all, but the Hermits Cave. This cave has been cut from the rock and is complete with door openings and window holes; it

is very unusual. The cave is very old, being mentioned first in 1648. The Old River Trent has an interesting history. The course of the river was altered artificially so that 300 acres 1.2 km 2 changed sides. This is commented on in Shakespeares play Henry IV, Part 1.



Picnic Pastries

ational Picnic Week 2021 takes place this year between 19th - 27th June. What better way to spend a lazy summers afternoon, responsibly social distancing, than in a lovely location with your family, playing games and tucking in to a picnic.

Although the concept of the picnic originated in France, the British have very much taken it to their hearts. An inexpensive day out, a picnic provides the chance for quality family time playing traditional games such as rounders or just relaxing with a good book.

The only real rule of a picnic is to tidy up when you leave. Apart from that the beauty of the picnic is it can be personalised to suit every family. So whether you are a traditionalist in the food you pack or an adventurous foodie, the important thing is just to be outside having fun.



Ricotta & Spinach Squares

Ingredients

375g pack ready-rolled puff pastry

100g bag young leaf spinach 150g ricotta

1 large free-range egg, beaten 20g freshly grated Parmesan

Method

- Preheat the oven to 220C/200C Fan. Cut the puff pastry evenly into 4 rectangles.
- Put the spinach in a colander and pour over boiling water to wilt. Cool under cold water then really squeeze out the water. Tip into a bowl and mix with ricotta, beaten egg, parmesan and season to taste.
- Spoon onto 1 half of each pastry rectangle and brush the edges with beaten egg. Fold the pastry over the filling, seal with a fork and transfer to a baking sheet. Brush with more beaten egg and bake for 15-20 minutes, until risen and golden.



Chorizo Chicken Puff Rolls

This recipe is great for using up leftover pasta sauce!

Ingredients:

200g leftover pasta sauce 1 cold cooked chicken breast or pack of cooked chicken 50g finely chopped chorizo 320 g pack ready-rolled puff pastry

1 egg - lightly beaten (this will be your egg wash)

1 tsp black sesame or nigella seeds

Method:

- Preheat the oven to 200C/ 180C Fan.
- •Mix together your pasta sauce, shredded chicken and finely chopped chorizo.
- •Unroll the pastry and slice in half lengthways.
- •Spoon chicken-chorizo mixture down the middle of the two lengths of pastry. Brush the edges with egg wash and fold the pastry over, so the edges meet. Use a fork to press down the edges.
- Brush the tops of the two long rolls of pastry with egg wash, then slice each roll into 9 or 10 pieces.
- •Sprinkle with the seeds and transfer the pastry pieces to a large, non-stick baking sheet leaving at least ½ an inch of space between each pastry.
- •Place in the oven and cook for 15 - 20 minutes, until golden brown.
- •Remove from the oven, allow to cool for 5 minutes (or completely if preferred) and serve





une already and yet, where did spring go? Warmth and a few nightly showers to help grass and crops grow tall will be very welcome!

Farmers all over are limbering up for silage making if they haven't already started-machinery checked and filled, trailers hitched and everyone waiting for the off.

Silage preserves the grass for the winter- a bit like making pickles when there is a glut, that you can bring out when there's a lack in winter. It provides feed for livestock and isn't as reliant on the weather as hay making, but it doesn't need rubbish lurking in the long grass- fly tipped grass clippings/ wood and plastic get incorporated into silage if it isn't spotted and can contaminate the end product, causing illness or even death of the animal.

It is crucially important that the machinery is working well and everyone has the number of their mechanic to hand, as a breakdown is the last thing needed when we are so busy. Wasted hours cost and make for a grumpy farmer!

Most agricultural income goes back into the local economylocal mechanics, local workforce, local feed firms etc, so it makes sense to sustain a strong, profitable farming industry, whether that be dairy, livestock or arable.

As we come to the end of this seasons calving, the young cattle look content as they laze in the sun, tails twitching flies away, before leaping up to find their mums and sucklefoamy milk dripping from their mouths.

Our new lambs, getting on for two months old now, are nibbling at fresh grass and inquisitively investigating whatever their mum is keen to eat. Cade (bottle fed) lambs have been weaned onto a full diet of grass and some lamb pellets to aid growth, but they still call and rush over whenever they hear my voice (which can make crossing the field a tricky experience as their sharp little hooves dig into my leg as they jump up and then get under my feet!).

As you walk the footpaths, you may see Burnet moths on our field margins (a strip of unworked/sprayed/grazed land running alongside arable ground) as they feed on the Birds foot trefoil and vetches. They have green forewings spotted with crimson and crimson hindwing, they take two years to mature. If its warm, you will see the Buzzards high up, circling on the thermals, calling eerily and, if you look down, maybe small animals or birds dashing out of your way.

oin millions of people reducing their plastic waste in 'Plastic Free July'. One of the most challenging things about creating a sustainable lifestyle is the amount of plastic in our life. Plastic isn't as bad as how we use it is and if we are sustainable with our practices and mindful a little can go a very long way.

Cloth Nappies: The vast majority of disposable nappies are not recyclable and by the time they are potty trained, it is estimated a baby could have 4.000 6.000 used to disposable nappies.

Summer Safety

he warmer weather can be an enjoyable time for both you and your pet, however it is important you aware of the risks hot days can bring.

Keeping your pets safe on a hot day

Conditions such as heatstroke can be easily prevented by taking precautionary measures on a hot day. Follow the steps below to ensure your pet is kept safe.

- Take your dog for walks early in the morning or late in the evening when the temperature is cooler
- Never leave your pet in the car, even with the windows open
- Ask a neighbour to check on your pet if they are kept outside
- •Use fans to increase air circulation
- Add ice cubes to water to keep it cooler for longer
- Cover rabbits or guinea pig cages with a wet towel and put them in the shade
- If you think your pet has been stung, bathe the area in cold water and if possible, try to remove any stingers you can see
- •Wet your pet with a hose pipe if they are panting heavily
- •Spray small animals with a fine mist of water
- •Keep your pet inside when possible
- Provide two bowls of water in case one gets knocked over
- Make sure your pet has a shaded area to relax in

- •When barbecuing, keep your pet away from leftover bones or other foods that could get stuck in their digestive tract
- Provide your pet with a paddling pool to cool off in.

Symptoms of heatstroke

- •Heavy panting and raspy breath
- •Skin feels warmer than usual
- •Anxious expression or staring appearance
- Seizures
- Elevated rectal temperature
- Vomiting
- •Collapsing, stumbling or falling down
- Salivation
- Open mouth breathing
- Lying flat on cool services
- •Bright red gums.

What to do if you suspect heatstroke

If you suspect that your pet has heatstroke, follow the steps below;

1.Immediate veterinary attention is recommended. Call your vet to tell them that you are on your way

2.Whist travelling in a car, keep your air conditioning on or your windows down.

At the vets, treatment may include any of the following:

- Intravenous fluids
- Oxygen
- •Blood test (to determine if any organs have been damaged).

Severe cases can have a significant risk of death and may require hospitalisation.


Which types of pet are most susceptible to heatstroke?

All pets can suffer from heatstroke, but some types are more susceptible than others. This includes;

- Dogs that exercise excessively in hot weather
- Short snout breeds
- •Pets that have recently relocated to hotter climates
- Cats with shortened faces like the Persian
- Elderly or ill pets
- Pets with heart conditions
- Pets who have suffered from heatstroke before
- Caged pets that are unable to seek cooler environments
- •Overweight pets.

If you are concerned that your pet may have heatstroke, please call your vet immediately.
