

Sourdough September



seems that Sourdough bread is everywhere these days. Sourdough even has it's own month - but what exactly is Sourdough?

Sourdough is a unique type of bread because it does not require any yeast as an added ingredient, as do other rising breads. It features a wild yeast and bacteria culture that arises

naturally from microorganisms present in flour. A starter culture can be added, to produce a specific flavor depending on the type of healthy bacteria present, but it is not necessary. All one needs to make a sourdough culture is flour and water.

The bacteria in a sourdough bread culture is Lactobacillus, or lactic acid bacteria, which is also used in such foods as sauerkraut, kimchi, pickles, cheese, and yogurt. It is this bacteria that gives this bread its characteristic sour flavor, while the yeast allows the bread to rise. The yeast and bacteria naturally present in flour are activated by mixing in water and leaving it in a warm

environment. Different types of flour are more or less rich in microorganisms, sometimes unwashed organic grapes are added to the mixture to increase the natural yeast and help the culture to develop.

Sourdough starter is fed daily with yeast and water.

A sourdough culture, known as a starter or sponge, must be "fed" daily when it is young with fresh flour and water. As the culture matures, it can be refrigerated and fed less often. A part of the culture is used for every new loaf of sourdough bread. A well maintained sourdough culture can serve a baker for many vears!

¬attle and calves are lounging under the trees, taking shade from the summer heat(or thundery showers)- they have a routine of where and when they move and when they graze or lay down

Actually, growing more grass means not using as much energy as if it were a corn crop and it ties carbon into the land. thereby helping our carbon footprint- something farmers are having to become more aware of.

Just like other farms, our harvest begins too, with the wheat and oats being cut, ready to be used for our livestock feed and remaining straw baled- to be used for feeding as well as bedding over winter. hoping the weather will be kind this month and send some benevolent, settled warmth so we can all combine and bale relatively unstressed- some chance. I fear!

Summer agricultural shows are few and far between because of uncertainty over Covid (as they take many months and much financial investment to keep them running) but they are an important social occasion in the rural and agricultural way of life.

Wildlife, such as mice and hares run along the stubble and big, grey pigeons scavenge grain. Collared dropped Doves- a pale beige colour, first seen in this country in the fifties- also tuck in.

Along the ditches, Rose- bay Willowherb grows tall and spiky, with its soft green leaves and fluorescent pink flowers, attracting bees and moths.

The Elephant Hawkmoth is especially attracted and lays its eggs on the Willow-herb and caterpillar is quite spectacular, rearing up when disturbed and showing 'eye spots'.



Plum Clafoutis

rith the super summer we've had fruit is ripening quickly and this year will be super sweet with all those sunshine sugars. Did vou know that 24th August is Plum Day? The perfect time to try this baked French dessert of fruit. arranged in a buttered dish and covered with a thick flan-like batter. The clafoutis is dusted with powdered sugar and served lukewarm, sometimes with cream.



Ingredients:

6 tbsp caster sugar
14 plums, halved and destoned
3 eggs
300ml semi-skimmed milk
75g plain flour
1 1/2 tsp lemon zest
1 dsp vanilla
1 pinch salt
1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
2 tbsp icing sugar

Method:

Prep:10min → Cook:1hr Ready in:1hr10min

- Preheat the oven to 190 C / 180 C Fan.
- Butter a 25cm fluted flan tin and sprinkle 1 tablespoon of caster sugar over the bottom.
- Arrange the plum halves, cut side down, so that they cover the entire bottom of

- the pie dish.
- Sprinkle 2 tablespoons of sugar over the top of the plums.
- In a blender, combine the remaining 3 tablespoons of sugar, eggs, milk, flour, lemon zest, cinnamon, vanilla and salt. Process until smooth, about 2 minutes. Pour over the fruit in the pan.
- Bake for 50 to 60 minutes in the preheated oven, or until firm and lightly browned.
- Let stand 5 minutes before slicing. Dust with icing sugar before serving.
