

Soups for the Soul



Taco Chicken Soup

onion, chopped
red pepper, chopped
tsp salt
500ml chicken stock
tin chopped tomatoes
green chilli chopped
tin cream of mushroom soup
Cooking oil
tbsp mexican spice mix
1/2 tsp ground cumin
1/4 tsp ground black pepper
500g diced chicken breast
Small bunch of fresh coriander
Some grated cheddar

Fry onions, red pepper and 1tsp salt in a large pot until softened, add stock, choped tomatoes, mushroom soup and green chilli. Gently simmer.

Mix 2 tablespoons of cooking oil with the mexican spice mix, 1tsp salt, cumin and pepper in a bowl and add chicken and stir to coat.

Add spiced chicken to soup and simmer until the chicken is cooked through.

Serve and sprinkle with grated cheese and chopped coriander.



Broccoli & Stilton Soup

1 onion, chopped 1 tbsp olive oil 2 heads broccoli, chopped 2 potatoes peeled & cubed 1ltr vegetable stock Stilton cheese (to taste) Salt Pepper

Sautee onions in olive oil until softened, add potatoes and vegetable stock.

Simmer until the potatoes start to soften and then add the broccoli and cook until tender.

Carefully blitz the vegetables with a hand blender (using a clean tea towel over the pot to prevent hot soup splashes).

Crumble the stilton into the soup and salt and pepper to your preferred taste, you may need less salt than you would normally use.



Warming Noodle Soup

200g cooked tofu pieces 170g soft udon noodles 1 small red chilli pepper 1/2 inch fresh ginger 1 ltr vegetable stock 1 carrot, matchstick chopped 6 spring onions, chopped 1 pak / bok choi 150g shitake mushrooms Sesame oil Light soy sauce

Bring vegetable stock to a gentle simmer, finely chop the ginger and add to stock.

Add the carrots, white parts of the spring onions, mushrooms and noodles to the stock.

Cook until noodles are almost ready. Add sesame oil and soy sauce to your preference and then add bok / pak choi to cook until wilted.

Serve in bowls garnished with finely chopped red chilli and green parts of spring onions.

Whether you're a meat eater, veggie or vegan, we hope you will enjoy trying one of these three delicious and comforting autumn evening warmers!

CARDINE SERVICE

"To bend with apples the moss'd cottage-trees, And fill all fruit with ripeness to the core." Keats -Ode to Autumn

s Autumn arrives we must not forget that we have a population of 70million people to feed and with floods in Germany and Austria and 'heat domes' in North America, we cannot presume that we will easily import any shortfall and if new governmental policies discourage or undermine farming, how will our needs be met?

Many will be starting to trim hedges as the bird breeding season has finished, especially along roadsides, where field work needs to be carried out or where there is a need to manage the hedge(if it's getting slightly too tall maybe).

Here, we leave it as late as possible and only do half at once, not neat and tidy but providing lots of feed and habitat for wildlife.

We'll have some of our apples ready for picking this month, although most of our trees are later ripening varieties, along with the crab apples in the hedgerows.

We replanted an ancient orchard with Derbyshire varieties of Apple nearly ten years ago and they are maturing slowly, protected by a large hedge from the cold easterly winds. Most of our apples are used by cider makers but I manage to store enough to feed us into the new year. After harvesting, the trees would sleep through Autumn until being 'wakened' by wassailing around January 17th (the old twelfth night) when they would be awakened by noise to drive off evil spirits and a feed of cider soaked toast! Somewhat like a harvest festival, thanks given for the production of food for the coming year.





Pet Treat Tips

ur furry friends are an extension of our family, and we delight in giving them treats and seeing them enjoy themselves. We all love a good treat ourselves, right? A little bit of cake, a bag of crisps – so why can't our fur babies have something tasty too? They definitely can! Here are some tips to ensuring treats are both tasty and safe for your pet.

Check human food is safe. There are lots of foods that are fine for us but definitely not for our pets. Always be careful and check before giving your pet any human food.

Many foods can be too high in fat and cause tummy upset or may even be seriously toxic and can cause irreparable damage to their organs.

Sometimes our animals have allergies just like us and human food can cause very scary side effects. Even healthy food like fruit and veg isn't always safe.

Give Dental Treats Sparingly Keeping our pet's teeth clean is essential for their health, however dental treats aren't always the best way to do this. Often dental treats contain a lot of fat and can add to your pet's waistline while not actually doing much for their teeth. Use them sparingly.

While they are young our pets have very different needs

when it comes to treats. Their baby teeth, although very sharp, can be very fragile and cannot handle the same pressure as adult teeth. For this reason, it is important to ensure treats are softer and suitable for puppies and kittens.

Giving bones and hard treats can cause fractures in baby teeth and cause a lot of pain if the nerve becomes exposed and sometimes even requires the tooth to be removed.

It is very common for people to give their pets yoghurt or milk as a treat. Unfortunately, our pets are not able to digest dairy very well and it can affect their digestive system giving them stomach ache or even diarrhoea. It is best to avoid dairy all together and buy specific dog or cat milk if you like to give this as a treat.

Often when our pets have certain health problems, they require particular food and nutrition to help support them properly. Treats can often get in the way with this and cause u n w a n t e d issues for our pets. It is important t h a t treats are suitable for your pet's condition as well as their main diet.

It is important to ensure we don't give too many treats – some pets will eat all their treats as well as their normal dinner and start to gain weight.

The timing of when we give treats is also important to consider. Often inappropriate treats timing of can accidentally lead to rewarding unwanted behaviours and confuse our pets. It is important to reward for behaviour we enjoy so time treats carefully and if not during training always ask for a command your pet knows, such as sit, before they receive the treat.
