#### **Pinecone Wreath**

his year, if you want to do your bit for the environment, dispense with with plastic garlands and why not have a go at making this adorable pinecone wreath! You can make it to match your Christmas colour scheme this year!



#### You will need:

- Pinecones
- Cardboard
- •3 x shades of green paint
- Paintbrushes
- Small pompoms or circles of felt or buttons or large beads
- •Wide ribbon
- A hot glue gun and glue sticks
- Scissors

#### What do do:

1. Paint your pincones using your three colours of green paint, making sure to get in between all the pinecone spines.





2. Cut out a donut shape out of your cardboard, making it any size that you like.



3. Paint your cardboard donut using your darkest shade of green paint.



4. When your pinecones and cardboard donut are dry, heat up the glue gun and carefully glue your pinecones around your donut at different angles.





5. Stick your pompoms, felt, buttons or large beads to the top of each pinecone.



6. Tie a bow and glue it to the bottom of your wreath.

7. Glue a loop of ribbon to the top of the back of your wreath. Once cooled and the glue has set you can hang your wreath wherever you like!

## By The Barn by Angela Sargent

"The leaf drops: earthworms draw it in At night- time noiselessly, The fingers of birch and beech are skeleton -thin And yet on the beat are we." Thomas Hardy

ovember and we hope the weather is kind-dry and crisp, not dank and wet. With the days noticeably shorter now (and getting shorter day by day), with some of our livestock still outside, we must tend to them whilst we can easily seetaking out silage if needed, checking for signs of illness etc.

Our younger cattle have been brought inside already, with a view to marketing when they are at their peak and we will be selling some of our older cows too, this winter, having tested for bovine TB last month-part of our twice yearly (fingers crossed) routine.

These require daily feeding and regular bedding- hopefully our grain and straw /silage harvests will see us through until spring.

We have more grass about this time, with giving the arable

ground a grass break as part of the crop rotation and this will provide extra keep for our sheep- ewes and tups, our own lambs and bought in lambs. The latter two categories will sold throughout autumn/winter as they grow to a suitable size for our clients. Hopefully the ewes have mated and will produce strong and healthy lambs from March onwards, especially if we look after them well. But they can remain outside.

Striding out across the fields hedges we notice the beginning to get that empty look as the birds clear them of the berries that gave them the red hue, leaves also blowing off as the winter storms hit too! Slipping on the muddy banks of ditches, the thistles are still prickly enough and the nettles are still coarse enough to give a sharp nip.

The streams are bordered by brown and grey straggly remains of the colourful Willowherb, reeds and grasses, providing cover for all manner of small birds and animals and probably harbouring insect eggs and dormant adults

These streams that form our boundary, have watered our livestock and provided hours of entertainment for our children as they were growing, as paddling pools, fishing ponds and for sailing on with home-built rafts. Flooding often at this time of year and over the winter, they've also fertilised the meadows of which they border, but also left stray branches, flotsam to dam them and slow the water down.

Other farms will be harvesting the maize crop now, a high nutrition addition to the feed mix for highly performing cattle. Unfortunately, it's usually muddy and some, unavoidably, carries onto the road. This is cleared up as soon as is reasonably possible, but please be aware when driving along the rural lanes.

Burton and District Mind is a charity focusing on supporting people with mental health problems. We are here to make sure anyone that has a mental health problem has somewhere to turn to for advice and support.

Through various services and resources offered, we help over 3000 people a year across Burton on Trent and East Staffordshire, Lichfield and Tamworth. We started in 1991 and will not stop until everyone experiencing mental health problem gets both support and respect.

It is often reported that 1 in 4 people experience a mental health problem of some kind each year in England. This is why we urge anyone who feels they need help that we are always here, we are listening and together we will find you help.

The services available include visits to community groups, counselling, peer support, ecotherapy, holistic therapy, as well as resources to help within the workplace.

Services such as counselling provide the opportunity to explore issues people may be experiencing with one of our fully qualified counsellors. The most straightforward route into this is a phone call to the Staffordshire Wellbeing Service on 0300 3030 923. As part of a project funded by Children in Need we work with several schools across the area to help students who are struggling with mental health problems.

espite the dangers winter can sometimes present, winter walks with your dog can be safe and enjoyable providing you take the necessary precautions.

Take a look at our nine top tips to keep both you and your dog safe while walking during the winter months.

Consider a coat for dog During the winter months, it's important to keep your dog warm. Let your dog's coat grow and for short-haired breeds, senior dogs and puppies, it may be worth investing in a winter dog coat.

#### Winter walks

Walking your dog during the cold, dark mornings and nights can present its challenges; poor visibility being one of them. If you're walking when it's dark, it's a good idea to make sure your dog is visible either with a flashing collar light or a high-vis jacket.

It's important you're also dressed for winter. Think about your own footwear when you're venturing out with your dog and make sure you're just as visible as your dog.

Beware of deep snow

The British weather is often unpredictable. Keep your dog on a lead if it's snowing. There could be some deep pockets of snow or snow which maybe covering up some unsafe areas.

ID tag and microchipped It's important to ensure that your dog is wearing a collar, ID tag and is microchipped. It's also vital to ensure your microchipping database is up to date with your address and contact details.

Returning from a walk

When you and your dog return from a winter walk, remember to wipe your dogs' legs, feet and stomach. The grit from roads and dampness from rain or snow can irritate their skin.

Don't leave your dog in a car Leaving dogs in cars is dangerous all year round, even in winter. You should never leave your dog unattended in a car.

Frozen ponds

Don't let your dog walk across frozen ponds. The ice may not be thick enough to take the weight of your dog.

Anti-freeze is poisonous
Even the smallest
amounts of
anti-freeze
can have
a very

harmful and it can often have a fatal effect on your pet. Keep anti-freeze well out of pets' reach and clean up any spillages right away.

Check leads, collars and harnesses

It's a good idea to check items such as leads, collars and harnesses are all in working order. They can often get damaged by the winter weather e.g. wet weather may make metal clips rust.


