

Easter Traditions Around The World

hough today it is perhaps most celebrated as a time to gorge ourselves on various egg-shaped chocolate delicacies, Easter is celebrated differently around the world.

EGG KNOCKING

In the US state of Louisiana, they've been knocking eggs together for around sixty years. It's all part of a competition where you're knocked out if your egg cracks, leaving just one winner remaining.

SILENT FRENCH BELLS

Church Bells in France and parts of Belgium and the Netherlands stay silent for a number of days in the run up to Easter. The tradition says that the bells fly out of their steeples and fly to Rome, returning on Easter morning bringing both coloured eggs and hollow chocolate shaped like eggs and rabbits.

GERMANIC EASTER FIRES

Much like Bonfire Night in the UK, the northern and eastern parts of the Netherlands, as well as many parts of Northern Germany, light fires at sunset

on Easter Day. This is a pre-Christian tradition, dating back to Saxon times when the people believed that the fire helped spring to become victorious over winter.

HOT CROSS BUNS

Traditionally associated with Good Friday, but now eaten throughout the year, these delicious spiced buns are served primarily in Britain, but also in the United States, Australia and New Zealand (where currants are often substituted for chocolate chips) and also in the Czech Republic, where it is a cake known as Mazanec.

OPENING DOORS

In Portugal, a catholic tradition of Easter is to join the family, open the doors of the house and receive the blessing of the Holy Cross. In that moment, a blessing is read and the house is sanctified, as well as the family. After that, the family gets together to eat and chat, and it is usual for grandparents and godparents to give money or presents to children.

GIANT OMLETTE

Every year, thousands of spectators gather in the town of Bessieres, located in southwestern France, to watch cooks prepare a 15,000 egg omelette.

SMASHING MORNING

Starting at 11 a.m. on Holy Saturday, you probably don't want to be walking through the streets of the Greek city of Corfu. Residents throw pottery from their windows in a noisy tradition that has been linked to a Venetian ritual in which people threw their possessions out the window in hopes of receiving new ones.

SCANDINAVIAN WITCHES


For children in Sweden, Easter looks much like Halloween, children dress up as Easter witches and travel door-to-door collecting candy in return for paintings and drawings.

Finnish children follow a similar tradition, but they hand neighbors catkin branches and recite healthy wishes instead of artwork.

Bunny Buddies



his Easter, why not make a host of cute bunny buddies to gift to friends and relatives? What's great about these little fellas is you don't need to be able to sew!

SHE HAS

You will need...

- Odd socks
- Scissors (sharp enough to cut the sock material cleanly)
- Rice for stuffing (or an alternative of your choice)
- Twine or string
- Ribbon
- A marker pen
- Tape

Step 1

Fill a sock with rice (or your choice of stuffing) up to the beginning of the heel. You can make your life a little easier by

using the tape roll to hold the sock open while you stuff it (by passing the sock through, then folding the ankle of the sock back over the roll). The sock needs to be able to stand vertically on its own when stuffed.

Step 2

Form a "pear" shape with more stuffing at the bottom than top. Pinch 2/3 of the way up the stuffed area to push the stuffing up into the heel and form separate head and body parts. The ankle of the sock above the "head" will be used to form the ears.



Step 3

Tie off the sock immediately above the stuffing that forms the head using twine or string.

This distinguishes the ears from the head. Ensure you tie it off tightly & securely as this will keep the stuffing in the sock.

Step 4

Using another piece of twine or string, tie off the neck of the rabbit between the head and the body.

Step 5

With the heel (which will become the face) facing toward you, cut down the centre of the ankle of the sock to form the ears. Shape these as you wish by trimming material from the ankle – long and floppy, short and oval, asymmetric – it's your bunny!

Step 6

Give your sock bunny eyes and a mouth with the marker, dots for the eyes and an X for the mouth work really well!

Step 7

Add a ribbon around your bunny's neck, tying a bow to one side.

You could also add a tail by pinching & tying off a small section with more twine.

What's great about these bunnies is you can make subtle bunny coloured ones or if you have crazy socks, some bonkers coloured bunnies!

A arch heralds spring and very welcome too! The dawn chorus is increasing as the weather improves and the extra warmth and sunshine bring out the early leaves.

Busy farmers will be out fertilising the grass fields, sowing any Spring crops as early as they can, to get a head start on jobs and lambing.

We, unfortunately, had dogs upsetting our young sheep earlier in the year. The ewes are now either heavy in lamb or have young lambs at foot, it is as crucial that they are not upset. Anything like we experienced will result in deaths and mismothering, causing unnecessary trauma. Who can run 100m in 5 seconds? Dogs can, you can't!

Everyone thinks their dog wouldn't do such a thing, but these owners thought so too! Keep your dogs on leads around any livestock, only letting them loose if you feel threatened by cattle.

Dairy cattle, also being turned out and will be producing more milk as the grass begins grow. The nutrients contained within and more and more evidence is being obtained that milk is one of the best drinks to consume straight after hard exercise as it contains just the right balance of vitamins, proteins and carbs to aid muscle recovery!

We see quite a few Magpies around the trees and hedges. Unmistakeable with their black and white plumage and long tail. Many superstitious beliefs involve these birds- my mum used to salute and say "ave ave captain"! Attracted to bright or reflective things and a ravager of other birds nests, you can't mistake them.

The glint of purple of a Dog violet from under a hedge or on a sunny bank is a lovely sight and reminds us that the earth is reawakening after winter.

Perfect Spring Pie

Pies are quintessentially British, we are a nation of pie eaters! Though not a British invention (we have early Egyptians and Romans to thank for that), it's hard to think of another dish that is so much a part of the DNA of our food culture.

Lamb has long been the centerpiece on spring holiday menus in England, Greece, Italy, and France, where sheep are raised. On the Passover and Easter tables, lamb is an ancient tradition. The meat is closely associated with Passover; later Christians made the Passover lamb a symbol of Jesus. It is also now that at this time of year, young lambs, born last winter, are available.

So dust off your rolling pins and get baking for Pie Week between 7th - 12th April! Here's a super spring filling idea: try something new instead of meat and potato or apple. If making pastry is not your thing there's no shame in using shop-bought pastry!

Lamb Pie

(Gloucestershire Squab Pie)

Ingredients:

- 3 tbsp plain flour
- ½ tsp flaked sea salt, plus extra, to taste
- freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 1kg lamb neck fillet, fat trimmed, cubed
- 2-3 tbsp rapeseed oil
- 2 onions, peeled, halved and sliced
- 1/2 tsp freshly grated nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp ground allspice
- 1 sprig rosemary eaves finely chopped
- 500ml chicken or lamb stock
- 300ml cold water
- 2 Cox apples peeled and sliced
- 4-5 large fresh sage leaves, finely sliced
- Ready roll pastry
- 1 egg, whisked

Method:

Mix the flour with some salt and pepper and coat the lamb pieces. Fry in small batches until brown. Fry the onion until softened. Transfer the lamb and onion to a large heavy pan or casserole dish. Add the nutmeg, allspice and rosemary to the pan then pour over the stock and water. Bring to boil then reduce heat and simmer until the lamb is tender and the liquid is a gravy consistency. Season to taste then leave to cool for at least 30 minutes.

Mix the apples together with the sage and some black pepper and set side.

Line your pie tin with pastry and add half of the lamb mixture, then half of the apple mixture, then lamb and then apple again.

Top with pastry and decorate with lattice made from strips of leftover pastry. Brush with egg wash. Pierce a hole in the centre of the lid to let steam escape during cooking.

Bake at 200C for 25-30 minutes.

If you wish, serve with spring greens, baby carrots and buttery mash for the perfect pie dinner. Not forgetting some extra gravy! Yum!

Saints Among Us!

▼ iven how famous Saint Patrick is both in Ireland and around the world, it's perhaps no surprise that many people don't know that Ireland actually has three patron saints. They are Saint Patrick, Saint Brigid and the lesser known Saint Columba.

Saint Brigid

Saint Brigid is Ireland's only female patron saint. She was born around the year 451 AD. During her life she was an early Irish Christian nun and founder of several convents.

Her most famous was the one built in Kildare in 480 AD. According to tradition she picked that place because it was the location of a shrine to an Irish goddess also called Brigid.

There are many legends told about Saint Brigid, perhaps the most famous one was her apparent ability to turn water in to beer. During her life though she was totally devoted to God and was well known for her compassion generosity towards the poor.

There is much crossover between stories of the history of Saint Brigid and the pre-Christian goddess Brigid. Like the Saint, the pagan goddess is associated with poetry, healing, protection and the care of animals.

Saint Columba

Born in 521 AD in what is now known as County Donegal. Saint Columba was an Irish abbot and missionary. He is known as Saint Colmcille in Ireland and is credited with spreading Christianity from Ireland to Scotland.

The saint founded an abbey on the island of Iona off the west coast of Scotland, It soon became an important and influential centre for spread of Christianity Scotland and quickly became a place of pilgrimage - it's said that 48 Scottish kings, 8 Norwegian kings and 4 Irish kings are buried there!





Give Back to the Soil



ey there! 14th - 21st March is Compost Week all you green-fingered readers!

Seasoned gardeners have long known the importance of composting their garden waste and food scraps. Not only does compost enrich the soil, but it also loosens compact clay soils and enhances drainage while reducing many disease issues. These benefits mean better plant health, higher yields, and a more balanced moisture content. As a top dressing, compost slowly releases nutrients to soil and suppress help weeds.

The Composting Council lists the following physical, chemical. and biological benefits to composting: Modifies and stabilises soil pH Increases the soil's ability to hold essential nutrients Increases beneficial soil microorganisms Binds contaminants and degrades compounds Helps with wetland restoration and

erosion control Suppresses weeds and many pathogens

Here's some Dos and Don'ts for your compost heap maintenance:

Do: Add garden and other organic materials to the compost pile, including leaves, grass clippings, straw and hay, sawdust, and finely chopped or shred tree and shrub pruning.

Do: Build the compost piles in layers with 6 to 8" layers of plant material with a one inch layer of soil or previously made compost in between.

Do: Add a combination of green and brown plant material. The green provides the nitrogen and the brown adds the carbon. Both are necessary for the microbes that break down the organic material.

Do: Shred or cut large items before adding them to the pile, such compost branches and twigs, newspaper, etc. Smaller particles decompose faster.

Do: Add food scraps from produce items, such as apple cores, banana and orange peels, melon rinds, etc. You can also put coffee grounds

and eggshells on your compost pile.

Do: Turn the pile over occasionally or turn into another bin to mix; this aerates the material for more rapid decomposition.

Do: Add water occasionally if it doesn't rain so the pile is damp, but not soggy.

Do: Have patience. It will take two to four months for plant material in a compost pile to decompose if it is turned regularly. Otherwise it may take six months or more.

Don't: Add meat scraps, bones, fat, whole eggs, or dairy products to the compost pile because they decompose slowly, cause odours, and can attract rodents and pests.

Don't: aAdd pet faeces or used cat litter to the compost pile.

Don't: Add diseased plant material or weeds that have gone to seed.

Don't: Consider compost a substitute for fertiliser in your rather garden, but supplement. The nutrient release from compost is often too slow to supply all the nutrients necessary for good plant growth.


