Be a Birdy's Best Friend

ot only is May the 4th (be with you) Starwars Day, it's also Bird Day! During the spring, migrating birds move to their summer grounds. nesting excellent time for those new to birdwatching to learn to identify birds by species. Enthusiasts also know that birds will migrate through gardens and stop for a rest, a bite to eat, and a drink if the right habitat is provided. Stand prepared by your window with binoculars and watch as new visitors arrive daily. At this time of year birds are also nesting with the last of the frosts safely out of the Rearing young way. exhausting and a plentiful supply of food is important.

Did you know that certain birds favour different foods?...

Small seeds, such as millet, attract mostly house sparrows, dunnocks, finches, reed buntings and collared doves.

Flaked maize is loved by blackbirds.

Peanuts and sufnlower seeds are the food of

choice of tits and greenfinches.

Mixes that contain chunks or whole nuts are suitable for winter feeding only.

Pinhead oatmeal is excellent for many birds.

Avoid seed mixtures that have split peas, beans, dried rice or lentils as along with wheat and barley only the large species like phesants, pigeons and doves can eat them dry. These are added to some cheaper seed mixes to bulk them up.

Also avoid any mixture containing green or pink lumps as these are dog biscuit, which can only be eaten when soaked.



Both smooth and crunchy peanut butter can be fed to the birds in your garden.

Why not make some natural bird feeders by smearing some

peanut butter onto a pinecone and rolling in birdseed? You can also spread it onto slices of fruit like apple and hang from trees for a variety of treats.

You can also mix suet with birdseed and press into hollowed out orange halves for another hanging alternative.



Mealworms are a great natural food for birds and can be used to feed them throughout the year.

Creamy Hotpot

This tasty chicken hotpot dinner with leeks and cream cheese is a great family allrounder – perfect for your baby too. You can also freeze any leftovers.

Age: 7-9 mths Serves: 4 portions Prep time: 15 mins Cooking time: 20-25 mins Suitable for vegetarians? N

Ingredients

- ½ medium leek
- ½ medium carrot, peeled
- 1 small potato, peeled
- 1 tbsp green beans1 small chicken breast fillet
- ½ tbsp vegetable oil
- 150ml water
- 1 small spear broccoli
- 1 tbsp full fat cream cheese

- 1. Chop the leeks, carrots and potatoes. Trim and chop the
- Dice the chicken.
- 3. Heat the oil in a large pan. Add the chicken and fry for 2-3 minutes.
- 4. Now add the leeks, carrots, potatoes, green beans and water, bring to the boil, cover and simmer for about 20 minutes until the chicken and vegetables are cooked. If you'd like extra sauce, add a little more water during cooking.
- 5. Meanwhile, bring a small pan of water to the boil, add the broccoli and cook for 3-4 minutes until soft (or microwave if you prefer).
- 6. Turn the hotpot off the heat and stir in the cream cheese.
- Blend or mash the cooked hot pot until it is smooth with soft lumps. Serve 1/4 of the hotpot with the cooked broccoli as a finger food.

- 3. Divide the beans between the wraps and top with some cheese.
- 4. Roll up and slice as needed.
- 5. Slice the red pepper and celery into finger sticks, and serve alongside the bean wrap.



pring has sprung, finally! Longer days, lighter nights Jand warmer weather heralds a spurt in grass growth.

Our ewes are well into lambing and the mothers and young lambs will be turned out into the bigger fields, to take advantage of the extra grass available to them. Until our older pasture gets growing (it's always slower than the newer varieties), we may have to supplement them with some silage or hay and corn, just to make sure they're having enough to milk well.

Tiredness is a problem for farmers, at this time of year, with late nights lambing and long days working. This is when we have to be especially careful from a health and safety aspect.

The Front field pasture is covered in celandines, with Buttercups beginning to grow too, along the ridge and furrow and the line of stout Ash trees give shelter to the cattle if the wind bites

The neighbouring field, 'Horse close', probably named as it used to belong to the neighbouring farm (a farm no longer) and was possibly where the work horses were kept, has been sown with a temporary grass, hopefully, to provide us with extra grazing for our sheep and lambs or we might make silage of it. Field names are interesting and can give an indication of previous

use or a historical meaning and we have our fair share as does every farm.

Any of last year's male lambs that are still here will be weighed regularly and sent to market asap, preferably before they get two teeth.

Ted is now seven and knows when he can get close to the sheep and when he must keep his distance. Having been on the wrong end of an angry and protective ewe, he has learnt to keep well away from sheep when they have lambs at foot!

You Snooze You Lose

id you know that snoring noise and sleep disturbance is it a threat to our health? This April we've got 'National Stop Snoring Week taking place from 18th to 22nd April.

The sound of snoring is irritating and annoying and can lead to sleep deprivation for the bed partner. But the noise of snoring can also cause a number of health problems.

We all know how it feels if we have not had a good night's sleep – we feel tired and sleepy all day, bad tempered, lacking concentration, and generally irritable. Bed partners who are disturbed every night by snoring they experience these symptoms every day.

The noise level that starts to have an effect on sleep is around 40dB. The noise of snoring can range from about 50dB to 100+dB, and research has consistently found that when exposed to noise at these levels, it can have a negative effect on all areas of our wellbeing.

Noise at night has become a major problem, and many

people consider that a good night's sleep is a basic human entitlement essential maintaining good health. Indeed, sleep is so important World Health that the Organisation (WHO) document several categories of adverse health and social effects from noise.

Sleep disturbance can cause hearing impairment, daytime functioning, mental health problems, cognitive issues and negative social behaviour can symptoms of subjected to loud noise over a period Sleep of time. deprivation can also have a negative impact on body systems such as hormonal release, glucose regulation and cardiovascular function, leading to overall poor health.

Evidence has shown that the louder the noise, the worse the sleep. The quality of the noise is also an issue. Some noises can be subjectively annoying whilst others of the same level are not. It is well know that the noise of snoring is one that cannot be tolerated for long without disrupted sleep.

Some bed partners who sleep with their snorer every night

try to sleep through the noise and ignore it. However, it has been shown that although you may sleep through the night, the quality of sleep will be much reduced and you will not feel as refreshed in the morning as you should. Noise tends to reduce our deep refreshing sleep to more shallow sleep, and will also reduce dreaming sleep. It is well documented that bed partners of snorers have been found to be at risk of hearing loss due to continuous noise exposure.

Other partners find themselves re-locating to the spare room in the middle of the night in order to get a few hours of uninterrupted sleep. Many of them have feelings of guilt in leaving the bedroom – but they have a right to a good night's sleep. Nevertheless, the stress of the situation can put a great strain on the health and relationship of both partners.

So how can these issues be resolved?

The snorer must acknowledge the problem and take steps to resolve it. Snoring will not go away – it will only get worse if not addressed.

May Traditions

his May why not reconnect with some traditional customs to celebrate? There are many things that happen, from 'well dressings' to maypoles and morris dancing, here we look at where you can see some!



Well Dressing

An ancient custom known as Well Dressing is peculiar to England, and Derbyshire and Staffordshire in particular. The practice of well dressing dates back to the Celts but early Christians were not happy with the custom of dressing wells – they considered it water worship and promptly put an end to it!

Well dressing involves the decoration of springs and wells with pictures made from living plants and flowers, and usually happens in the summer and early autumn. Some places to visit well dressings are:

Chester Green Derby: At Marcus Street Well there are usually 3 dressings at the well at the end of Marcus Street. Chester Green is located on Mansfield Road, Derby, about

1.5km north of the City Centre. Use DE1 3SA for nearest map location.

Etwall: There are up to nine Well Dressings to be seen in the village. The village sometimes hosts Have-a-Go Well Dressing, providing a demonstration and an opportunity for everyone to try their hand, is made in a marquee on The Green during the course of the weekend. Etwall is located just off the A516. Use DE65 6LP for map location.

Tissington: There are up to Well Dressings. Tissington was the first village to re-introduce well dressing in 1349. after the managed to escape a terrible outbreak of the Black Death that swept through England at this time. Tissington is located to the east of the A515 Ashbourne to Buxton road, north of Fenny Bentley. Use DE6 1RA for map location.

Maypole

A maypole is a tall wooden pole erected as a part of various European folk festivals, around which a maypole dance often takes place.

The festivals usually are held on 1st May. In some places the Maypole is a permanent feature that is only utilised during the festival, although in other cases it is erected specifically for the purpose before being taken down again.

The good folk of Wellow in Nottinghamshire are rightly proud of their permanent Maypole and public May Day celebration take place on the Village Green every year on the Bank Holiday nearest to May Day. Use NG22 7EW for map location.



Morris Dancing

This is a traditional English form of folk dancing from the 15th Century, often performed on May Day by groups of men or women who wear different outfits depending on which part of the country they are from. Their clothes are white with coloured belts across the chest. There is Morris dancing at Mercia Marina at 8:30 on the 12th May

How to Treat Cat Fleas

oth the cat and the home must be treated at the same time to break the cycle. Veterinary treatments are safer and more effective than products available supermarkets. Most are topical (applied to the back of the neck) or tablets. At the same time. treat the remaining flea population off the cat with a spray which you can also purchase from your vet but please remember to follow the instructions on the tin (do not spray the cat!). Products purchased from pet shops etc won't do the job as effectively as those purchased from your vet so don't waste your money.

Vacuum daily and pay attention to nooks and crannies along skirting boards and under furniture. Empty the bag or canister each time you vacuum. Wash your cat's bedding weekly in hot water and hang outside in the sun.

Follow these instructions and your home and your cat will soon be flea free!!



Life on the Allotment by Tim Brooks



the early 19th century, there was sustained growth in the creation of allotments, sites created by rural landowners the church. Urban and allotments rented out to the working classes also appeared in this period, with plot increasing numbers from 243,000 in 1873, to 445,000 in 1890. To around 600, 000 in 1913. Food shortages after WW1 lead to even more being created. By 1914 there were 1,500,000 plots made, on land designated for growing food crops.

Sadly after WW2 things changed, as lifestyles altered and land was required for housing, industrial buildings and less interest. So many were lost to redevelopment of the land

Today around 330,000 allotments exist in Britain. Many have long waiting lists, due to a lack of space for growing vegetables at home,

as gardens are much smaller and folk have busier lifestyles generally. I myself am secretary and treasurer at our Bradmore Road Allotment site in Burton and not often do we have many vacant plots available.

We grow many crops ourselves, much is frozen too, for winter soups and stews. Things like runner beans, squashes, leeks, swedes, carrots, broad beans, parsnips, are all useful for winter use. We store squashes and pumpkins in our house as they make great soups and pies.

One thing allotments are good for is exercise and fresh air. You don't need a gym membership! Plus you meet interesting folk and its a great place to escape the daily stresses in life.

You could of course buy everything from supermarket, but chances are your shop bought veggies and fruit have been sprayed with insecticides. ı never use sprays, preferring growing without any chemicals at all. Even avoiding slug pellets, which are a big contributor to killing many hedgehogs in the UK. We grow enough for ourselves and rarely lose much to bugs.

We need a balance of wildlife and insects to help in a garden. Bees are lower in numbers now, so we grow sunflowers on our Allotment. The Bees love them and later on the birds eat the seeds. Its always a good idea to grow flowers among your vegetable beds. instance, growing Calendula (marigolds) planted next to runner beans, help deter black fly aphids. We need Bees for pollination, so plenty of flowers can only be a good thing.

We find a polytunnel invaluable too, as you can grow crops that need a warmer climate, like tomatoes, chillies and peppers, plus aubergines.

As secretary of our Allotment association, I recently decided to apply for a community lottery grant, as we needed a few new sheds. We were delighted to be successful with our application. So now this spring this project should take shape. Its important for the community to have these places to enjoy the outdoors and experience growing their own food, along with their families, bringing their children along and they can all get involved and maybe the children will get a passion for growing things too. This way, allotments will thrive for future generations as well, protecting vital green areas.

s our dogs age, we begin to see changes in their **L**appearance behaviour. While many of these changes are normal as a dog enters their golden years, it's important to be aware of the signs that could indicate your furry friend is unwell. 1. Your dog is slowing down and getting stiff

4. Smelly Breath

A whiffy breath could be one of the first things you spot as a dog mum or dad, and this could be a sign of gum diseases, which can become more severe with age. You may also see tartar developing around their teeth if you are in the habit of monthly mouth checks.

5. Sight Loss

Although this may be very gradual over time, you may notice your dog loses track of the ball during a game of fetch, or maybe lose a stick and come back with a completely different one! You may also see their eyes have a bluey white shine in their eyes, this could be nuclear sclerosis and

is normal for older dogs.

7. Grey Hairs


Many dog breeds will grow grey hairs and become a 'silver fox' as they start to age gracefully. Most commonly this can be seen around the mouth but this is completely normal for dogs as they age.
