s it just me (or my age) but don't the years seem to fly by, never mind the seasons! Suddenly we are half -way through the year, summer is here and farming is in high production mode!

Some will be finishing silage making, then changing to hay making if the weather forecast is ok and the grass has developed enough. With a husband who suffers drastically from hay fever, it is some years since we made hay, in fact its only a few years ago we sold our old baler (it made 'small bales' as opposed to the large ones which need a tractor to move them).

I've spent many an hour (after he had mowed, then retreated to the house to recover) turning, then rowing up the grass, over a few days. Hubby would bale it and then we would both load the hundreds of small bales onto trailerseight 'courses' high (approx. 300 bales) and then unload and fill the Dutch barns. between eleven and fourteen courses high, throwing them up, to be caught and ricked.

Of course, there was a technique to stacking so that each bale and each course 'locked' so to prevent falls as the hay compressed and dried further. sometimes parts did collapse. Such was the case when one

helper stacked them in a column 'to make them un-rick easier'!

Life became interesting when you were at the top, sweating under the roof and had to figure how to climb down! No health and safety then!

Our hay meadows are not as good as they once were but provide good year-round grazing, even if they get a tad heavy in winter, especially the one known as 'duzzybed'!

We will be worming, shearing and spraying lambs to avoid fly strike this month, so a busy time with the sheep. And continuing to market any fat lambs that are ready, whilst complying with withdrawal periods needed after using the aforesaid products- this means animals treated cannot be sold for a set period to ensure all health regulations are met.

Soft fruit farmers will be picking the myriad berries produced and sending them to the retailers.

Arable growers will be using fuel to tend their field crops.


growers will irrigating theirs to enable the spud to fill out and the Dairymen will be continuing to milk- all high energy users and with the spiralling costs of our energy, no wonder food prices will grow too.

In past years there were government strategies to keep food prices low (the farmers being compensated if costs got too great), but, as the pursuit of free trade intensified, market forces affect prices over here and if not right now, certainly next years costs will rise.

Will farmers be able to continue to produce as they have?

The dawn chorus reaches optimum this month numerous butterflies moths are to be seen along the ditches and hedgerows, in woods and flitting along the upland walls. Take an early morning walk, just as the sun rises and see and hear for

ourself.

Encourage your children to get



UEFA Women's Euros by Rhian Warriner

EFA Women's EURO 2022 is coming to England this summer and promises to be the biggest women's sporting event in Europe.

The Netherlands won the previous UEFA Women's Championship back in 2017, triumphing on home soil for the first time but a lot has changed since then. Can the Dutch defend their crown? Or will we see a different winner this year?

Current favourites are Spain with England a close second and have a fantastic chance of bringing the trophy home. Let's hope that it won't come to penalties!

The team will be led by 25 vear old Leah Williamson who has said "This is an incredibly proud moment for me and my family and I'm honoured to be asked to lead us at the EUROs". "Although I will be wearing the armband, I know we have a squad full of leaders who share my pride and passion in playing for our country. Whether I'm captain or not, I will never take anything for granted and will always do my best for England every time I pull on the shirt."

The tournament is scheduled to take place from 6-31 July and will see the pinnacle of women's football compete for Europe's biggest prize. 16 teams will be in action at 10

Vegetables in Summer By Tim Brooks

/ell, summer is finally here and it is always an exciting time on the allotments in June, when the strawberries are ripening and everything has probably been planted until the autumn. Its a case of watering well and weeding now. Feeding wise I use a seaweed fertiliser, either in powdered form or a liquid feed which you dilute. I like also using a natural feed, like putting comfrey leaves in a water butt, allowing them to decompose in the water. It makes a very good high potash feed, but dilute it with more water before using.

I'm growing carrots again this year, these like a fine soil and sowed thinly. Keep well watered until they germinate. Thin out if too close together and planting next to onions will help deter carrot fly. They also don't like freshly manured soil, it affects their tapered roots.

Cabbages and other brassicas can be tricky to grow, especially if your soil has club root. A disease which affects the roots, forming a tough tuber type root. There are resistant varieties of cabbages and cauliflowers available, though I also try adding garden

lime to the soil which helps a

Onions are another invaluable vegetable we grow, started from onion sets in April, the area raked over finely before planting out around 8 inches apart, fed with granular dried seaweed or similar fertiliser. Keep the area weed free and watered until they established. Onions leaves eventually turn yellow and bend over when ready. Gently fork them out of the soil around August and allow bulbs to dry out on raised netting or hang up to totally dry, before storing in a cool dry place.

Indoor tomatoes will need weekly feeding with a potash liquid feed and tying up as they grow up their supports. As a rule, best to pinch out the growing tip when around six trusses of the yellow flowers are formed. This gives more strength to the vines to develop bigger fruits.

With all these vegetables that will be available through out the summer, why not try this vegan coleslaw recipe to enjoy with your summer salads and on sandwiches!

Ingredients:

1/2 cup vegan mayo e.g. "Veganaise" or other type

Method:

- •Cut up and shred finely some red & green cabbage to a bowl add grated carrots and mix together.
- •Add the sugar or maple syrup along with the apple cider vinegar, again mixing well to cover all the cabbage and carrots.
- •Add the celery seeds and salt, mixing it all together.
- •Then finally add the half cup of Vegan mayo and mix well, adding a bit more if you prefer.



The woodland is the monkey's tranquil home in Trentham. The primates can go wherever they like as they aren't restricted by any bars or cages, allowing visitors to observe nature in a way that can't be replicated anywhere else in

the UK.

The park is open for visitors to explore the forest and be amazed from February until November.

Guests can see the monkeys' fascinating natural behaviours right in front of their very eyes, making it one of the most unique but affordable days out in the UK.

From young to old, all different age groups can be seen at the magical forest. They can be swinging from trees to babysitting in a flash. The park is great fun for little ones and will also inspire them to learn about animals and conservation.

The monkeys that live in Trentham are Barbary macaques, unfortunately these monkeys today are highly endangered. The population has decreased by more than

50% in the last 30 years and there are now fewer than 8,000 wild Barbary macaques left.

Monkey Forest is strongly committed to the protection of the species by:

- Raising public awareness for the need to protect this endangered species by giving people the opportunity to observe the Barbary macaques in a setting very similar to their natural habitat
- Developing educational information in order to help engage our visitors
- Working with organisations to help protect wild Barbary macaques, such as Barbary macaque Awareness and Conservation (BMAC)
