Safety in the Sunshine

Your skin is the largest organ your body has, it protects you and helps to regulate what's going on inside. Lets face it, during the summer our skin can take quite a battering. With scratches from gardening, mosquito and insect bites and sun exposure it can all get a bit too much. Start taking care of your skin so that it can take care of you.

Vitamins & Food

Olive Oil

Researchers have found that a higher consumption of olive oil (more than 2 teaspoons a day) was associated with 31% fewer signs of ageing compared to people who ate less. About 75% of the fat in olive oil is monounsaturated fatty acids, which may play a role in the youth boost. The antioxidant polyphenols in olive oil could also quench damaging free radicals.

Tomatoes

People who ate 5 tablespoons of tomato paste daily, along with almost a tablespoon of olive oil for 12 weeks, had 33% more protection from sunburn compared to a control group that ate just olive oil, according to a 2008 UK study. The antioxidant lycopene (levels of which are higher in cooked, processed tomatoes) improves skin's natural SPF. Though it's not a replacement for sunscreen!

Sardines

Fatty fish is particularly rich in the type of omega-3 called DHA, an anti-inflammatory. Along with salmon, these little fishies can help keep your skin clear.

Green tea

Research shows that people drank a beverage green tea containing polyphenols daily for weeks had skin that was more elastic and smooth, and had one- quarter less sun damage when exposed to UV light compared to a control group. The brew's catechins like EGCG (antioxidants) boost blood flow and oxygen to the delivers skin, which kev nutrients to keep your complexion healthy, say researchers

Lotions & Potions

Sunscreen

These are vital for skin health, as they absorb or reflect some of the sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation and thus helps protect against sunburn. Dependingonthe mode of action, sunscreens can be classified into physical sunscreens (i.e., those that reflect the sunlight) chemical sunscreens (i.e., those that absorb the UV light). organisations recommend the use sunscreen because it aids in the prevention of skin cancers. Many sunscreens do not block UVA radiation, which does not

primarily cause sunburn but can increase the rate of cancers. The use of broadspectrum (UVA/UVB) sunscreens can address this concern. Diligent use of sunscreen can also slow or temporarily prevent the development of wrinkles and sagging skin.

Moisturisers

These can play a key role in both adding water to the skin and keeping it hydrated. In order to help keep water in the skin, moisturisers contain substances called humectants. These are substances that are capable of attracting water and help to conserve the water in the skin. One of the oldest and best examples is glycerin, sometimes called glycerol. This has been the standard humectant for many decades based on its excellent safety record

In the case of dry skin, the skin cells are being shed too fast. Rather than being shed individually these come off in clumps that look like white flakes. Repeated application of moisturiser increases the watercontentandnormalises cell turnover. This is why it is important to continue using a moisturiser on the skin.

So to keep your skin in tip-top health this summer, be sure to keep it hydrated and protected!

uly already and with it brings the start of harvest for this year.

The rape will have been dessicated, or swathed. This is because the crop ripens unevenly but needs to be dry processing.It will be combined to produce a small black, poppy-like seed, which can then be turned into a highly nutritious oil.

Much was grown in Ukraine and exported overseas, but the horrific there has war interfered with that. Our thoughts are with those suffering there still.

Early combining of barley may also begin, if the weather is kind.

Silaging will be continuing until the farm has enough to cover the winter need-dairy farmers will need many 'cuts', but the nutrition of the grass will be dropping now. If we are lucky with the weather then some farmers will make hay, needing at least three good days, preferably more, to make good hay that keeps.

Shearing will be finishing, but we may be spraying the lambs to protect them from fly strike. Any lame ones(including ewes) will be treated and their growth assessed. Fit ones will be marketed and the rest will be wormed.

mid From month, conservation field margins can be grazed or cut and ground beetles plentiful, are particularly where there are 'beetle banks' in mid field. They hide under stones during the day and hunt caterpillars and worms at night.

Redshank, also known as Redleg, can be found on the bare Earth at the edges of fields. It has a red stem and narrow, pointed leaves with an oblong of tight knit pink flowers erect at the top and it is part of the dock family.

Along our drive we often see such plants, the occasional orchid or plentiful yarrow, eye bright, mousewort and self heal, along with those we

don't want, such as thistles and ragwort. In fact we've noticed where our cattle graze we get a good crop of buttercups and where the sheep graze we tend to get more thistles. These will be topped now to stop them spreading.

We've also seen a Roe deer on occasion, crossing our drivean unusual occurrence for us, as we are not that far from civilisation.

Summer is a great time for agricultural shows and we should be in full swing by now, everyone being pleased to re start after the last couple of years. Let's hope they are successful as they are one of the few places farmers tend to socialise.

Maybe we will be able to take time out from clearing out the sheds, some of which we have never really gone into for many years. It will interesting to see what we find!

Summer Skies

■ f you're a night owl, the summertime night skies can often offer you some of the best things to see, all you have to do is look up! Here are some of the summer's top astronomical events heading your way...

See the Perseid meteor shower

Mid-August will see the reappearance of the perseid meteor shower, caused by the debris stream from the comet Swift-Tuttle. The shower will radiate between the constellations Perseus and Camelopardalis, and you may see activity from mid-July. Best seen in the pre-dawn hours, it takes a bit of dedication, but it's worth it!

Get ready for the elongation of Mercury

Mercury is visible to the naked eye, but it is a bit of a challenge. It's so close to the Sun that the separation between the two isn't particularly large as seen from Earth. During the moment of greatest Eastern Elongation on 27 August, we'll have our best chance to spot it, low towards the west as the Sun is setting.

See a planet at opposition

Saturn moves into opposition on 14 August: its face will be fully illuminated by the Sun, so it will be at its brightest.

Neptune and Jupiter do the same on 16 September and 26 September respectively. These moments are potentially great opportunities astrophotography, but it may worth trying techniques out on Saturn first, because Neptune will be a real challenge.

However, even with the naked eye Jupiter and Saturn will be easy to see.

Avoid Those Tentse Moments!

any of us have a tent languishing in the loft or at the back of the garage. Camping can be a really fun and cheap way to have a summer get-away. If you're tempted to get outdoors, here's some tips to set up your temporary home in a super easy jiffy!

Read the instructions...

If you're like us, it's probably been a while since you set up that tent, so familiarise yourself with the 'How To', it'll save your sanity in the long-run.

No instructions!

Do an internet search. Many manufacturers' instructions are available online.

Put up the tent at least once... Don't wait until your camping trip to learn about pitching a tent! Try it in the privacy of your garden. If you don't have a garden, visit the nearest playground or park. Here's what to do:

Don't forget to pack...

A torch, lantern or head lamp

If you need to locate an item within your tent or visit the loo during the night, a portable, battery-powered light is invaluable. Many campers tout headlamps as the best option because of their hands-free functionality.

Toilet Paper

Hardcore survivalists may view toilet paper as an unnecessary luxury in the outdoors, but many campers swear to its necessity. Bark and leaves make poor substitutes for latrine duty in both comfort and hygiene, and a chapped backside can make sitting painful. Also, campgrounds with bathroom facilities have been known to run out of paper on occasion. If you're camping in the deep woods and concerned about the environmental impact of using toilet paper, purchase some that's biodegradable and use a trowel to bury it or take a refuse bag for disposal!

Why July?

ever wondered where the months get their names? July is the second month of summer and. generally, is the warmest month of the year in the Northern hemisphere, whilst also being the coldest in the Southern hemisphere.


Why is it called July?

July was originally the fifth month of the year in the tenmonth Roman calendar and was named Quintilis, which is simply latin for 'Fifth'. Original and clever...not much.

It was changed in honour of Julius Caesar (who, contrary to popular belief, was never actually a Roman Emperor, (though he had been proclaimed 'Dictator Perpetuity') when he was named as one of the Roman Gods two years after his assassination. This was done by the first Roman Emperor, Augustus Caesar, who was also Julius' adopted son.

Julius Caesar's Legacy

Iulius Caesar's name, too, became a title in itself, 'Caesar' became a shorthand Emperor in the Roman Empire followed. that This popularised even in the Bible, with the verse "Render unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's, and unto God the things that are God's". For two thousand vears after assassination, there was at least one head of state bearing his name, whether as a Kaiser in Germany, or as a Tsar (or Czar) in Russia. The last Tsar in power was Simeon II of





ational Allotments Week started in 2002 as a way of raising awareness of allotments and the role they play in helping to live healthier lifestyles, grow their own food, friendships develop and bolster communities. campaign week is still thriving 18 years later and interest in growing your own fruit and vegetables has never been stronger since the WW2 Grow for Victory campaign.

his 25th July has got to be one of our most favourite days of note. It celebrates two of the things that delight us the most. If like us you're a fan of Cheese & Wine, then this is the day for you! Surely there should be a Hallmark card for such an occasion?! In the absense of one, why not try out this delicious recipe that includes both dreamy ingredients!...

White Wine **Fondue**

Ingredients:

500g good cheddar cheese 300 ml milk 200 ml white wine 4 whisked egg yolks 10g plain flour 1 clove of garlic, peeled

Accompaniments:

herb roasted potoatoes, grapes, thick chunks of ham... Or anything else you love to eat with cheese!

Equipment:

A Large heatproof shallow dish and a smaller one that will fit inside it but big enough to serve the fondue.

Instructions:

- 1. Mix the wine and milk together in a jug.
- 2. Grate the cheese and place in a bowl over a saucepan of simmering water.
- 3. Add the milk and wine mixture and the whole peeled garlic clove. It should take 10-15 minutes for the cheese to melt. At first, you will see a mass, then slowly the cheese will melt and become more fluid.
- 4. Once you have reached the desired consistency, whisk the

- melted cheese a little at a time, mixing continuously.
- 5. If the mixture is too thick add a splash more wine to make sure the consistency is smooth and creamy.
- 6. Stir well and cook for another 10 minutes.
- 7. Once ready, pour the fondue into your fondue serving pot. Place the pot into your larger dish and fill the outer dish with hot water to keep your fondue warm.
- Serve the fondue immediately, while it's still hot, with your choice of things to dip into it.
