

# **Butterscotch Christmas Cookies**

Think of all those houses where all Santa gets to munch on is the same old mince pie. Why not give Santa a surprise this year and bake these fun and festive butterscotch cookies to leave with his glass of milk... or brandy!

## BUTTERSCOTCH COOKIES



Ingredients: 185g butter - softened 160g brown sugar 55g sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 egg 240g flour 2 packets of butterscotch flavour Angel Delight - not prepared 1 teaspoon baking powder ½ teaspoon salt 1 cup dark chocolate chips 1 cup white chocolate chips

1 cup red and green M&Ms

#### Instructions:

In a large bowl, cream the butter, brown sugar, and sugar for 1-2 minutes until fluffy and pale. Add vanilla and egg and mix well.

In another bowl whisk together flour, and dry angel delight, baking powder, and salt.



Gradually mix dry ingredients into wet ingredients until incorporated. Stir in most of the chocolate chips. (Reserve a few chocolate chips and the M&Ms for later) Cover and chill for at least one hour.



Preheat oven to 175C. Very lightly grease a baking sheet.

Roll about 3 tablespoons of cookie dough into a ball (Should be about the size of a golf ball) and place on a prepared baking sheet. Gently press remaining chocolate chips and the M&Ms into the cookie dough balls (this makes sure you can see the chips and the M&Ms after they bake!).



Bake for 9-12 minutes until cookies are set but still slightly underdone for a chewy cookie or 2-3 mins longer for a crunchy cookie.



Allow to cool for at least 10 minutes on the baking sheet. Transfer to a cooling rack to finish cooling completely. Store in airtight container at room temperature.

# By The Barn by Angela Sargent

s winter sets in and the short daylight hours make for increased use of lighting, many farmers are having to think carefully how they can reduce energy use or obtain it from different sources.

The last few years have seen increased numbers of wind turbines and solar panels on farmland and, with increased electricity costs, the use of fuel filled generators. Farming uses lots of energy, from the care and production of dairy through to the heating/ cooling poultry units to the of refrigeration of grown products to keep them suitable for consumption.

One method of energy production is the Anaerobic Digester, found on a few farms. This is where microorganisms break down biodegradable material, in the absence of oxygen. One of the end products is biogas, which can be used to generate electricity and heat or can be processed into renewable natural gas or transportation fuel.

Hedges are being trimmed or laid now and fallen trees from winter storms are sawn up and removed. Boundaries are maintained, most livestock having moved inside, but ewes can be seen grazing the fields and uplands, hopefully the rams having done their job.

Glancing out into shadowy paddocks as night falls, sometimes a fox might be glimpsed, looking for food or the white shape of a Barn owl silently hunting. The stark shape of leafless trees provide camouflage for other predator birds too. And the howl of the North wind brings sleet or snow to cover all tracks!



# **A Doggone Crime**



ate Kniveton, Member of Parliament for Burton and Uttoxeter, attended an event organised by the Dogs Trust in the House of Commons where the charity called on the Government to take urgent action to end the cruel practice of Puppy Smuggling. MPs from across the UK were invited to discuss with the charity how they can work together to bring an end to the illegal practice

Through five undercover investigations, Dogs Trust has revealed the falsifying of documents to import underage puppies, often unvaccinated and in poor welfare conditions, which go on to be sold to unsuspecting buyers in the UK.

An interactive station at the event illustrated the importance of introducing visual checks at the borders to put a stop to the cruel trade once and for all.

Commenting, Kate Kniveton MP said:

"I was shocked to learn about the horrendous ways puppies are smuggled into the UK and the poor conditions they endure.

"Dogs Trust is doing great work to raise awareness of this issue amongst legislators and to ensure that all dogs imported into Great Britain are done so legally.

"For this to be successful, I recognise it is vital that the requirement to carry out a visual check on dogs being imported is introduced. I, along with my fellow MPs will continue to support the work of Dogs Trust and will do what we can to encourage the introduction of visual checks."





# Wintertime Gardening Indoors by Tim Brooks

t is that time of year for a gardener like myself, when you long for the longer daylight hours to return again. The lack of daylight, together with the cold weather restricting what jobs you can get on with now.

However there are a few things you can sow indoors, like salad crops grown in a greenhouse or in a heated propagator. Types of lettuce like "little gem" or greens like corn salad and mustard plants.

Aubergines can also be sown indoors in а heated propagator, as these are slow growing plants. Sweet peas can also be sown now and you could use old toilet roll tubes filled with compost, stood upright in a tray, which give room for a deeper root system to develop. Protect indoors from frosts if placed on a cold windowsill. Pinch out the growing tips when about two inches tall. This encourages the side shoots to develop, which will produce more flowering stems later on.



You could also start sowing Geranium seeds in pots, again with the help of a propagator. For an early crop of broad beans, these can also be sown now under polythene, which should crop in may next year, a few weeks earlier than those sown in springtime.



Greenhouses are best lined with "bubble wrap" during the winter months, as it's a great insulation and keeps frosts away from delicate seedlings and overwintered plants stored in them. It also helps with germination when you start sowing more varieties early in the year. You can remove it in april to store for next winter.

Now is also a good time to start ordering your seed packets from the endless seed catalogues that drop through our doors this time of year. I usually order too many packets in over enthusiasm for the coming gardening season ahead. But at our allotment site L devised a "seed share" box. where you can put any unwanted or part-used seed packets, so others can use them or even share their unwanted packets, to save any waste.

If the weather is kind during December, there is still plenty of time for winter digging if you are lucky enough to have an allotment or a veg garden. It will save time in spring and give you a head start when it is time for sowing outside again. It is a good excuse for working off the "excess eating" most of us indulge in over the Christmas season!
