

- ☑. Doom-scroll: Turn off the electronics. Leave Facebook and texting alone to spend


time with your partner because today is about them, not your friends or videos of cats.

cold, dark start to the year and lots to do on

Slurry spreading may carried out to fertilise the fields and reduce the quantity stored. as livestock inside don't stop producing. But gas build up in slurry stores can be dangerous and care must always be taken.

Summer born calves will be weaned, if not when first brought inside, and a few noisy nights are endured until they get used to being without their mums.

Outwintered sheep may need extra feed if the weather turns particularly cold or snowy and that in turn can provide a problem if it's difficult to get to

them.

Early lambing ewes are heavy in lamb and need careful handling- if you drive past farms late at night you'll see the lights on in the lambing shed.

Repair work will be carried out now and maintenance of any farm machinery mostly used later on in the year.

We have left our farm now and what a spectacle the farm sale was as farmers and dealers (& old friends and family) came to spot a bargain.

From platters, tractors to ancient lawnmowers to sheep race hurdles, piles of bricks to childhood games - all went under the auctioneers gavel, in

field, yard and shed. Ninety vears of collected items that couldn't be taken with us.

The empty buildings and fields felt bereft of life for several weeks until the next generation was able to bring livestock on to the place.

Our sheepdog, Ted, has also retired and taken to being a house dog like a duck to water. It doesn't seem like 5 minutes when he was first brought to the farm as a pup and had to start to learn his trade (but his ears still prick up when he hears a whistle!).

Vegan Dundee Cake by Tim Brooks

fith 'Veganuary' in full swing and Burns Night around the corner on 25th January our regular contributor Tim Brooks has sent us his tried and tested Dundee Cake recipe to give you something seasonal to enjoy!

VEGAN DUNDEE CAKE

(Preparation time around 20 minutes)



Ingredients:

250g Light Brown Sugar 180g Dairy Free Margarine or Butter

4 Tablespoons of Marmalade 800g Self-Raising Flour 200g Ground Almonds 500g Dried Mixed Fruits

2 Teaspoons of Ground Cinnamon

1 pinch of salt Plant based milk Blanched almonds

Method:

- .I used a 10 inch diameter x 3 inch deep baking tin. Line tin with quality baking paper.
- Heat up oven to 160 degrees centigrade
- Mix together in a medium size bowl the following ingredients:

250g Light Brown Sugar 180g Dairy Free Margarine or Butter

4 Tablespoons of Marmalade.

• In a separate large mixing bowl add the following Ingredients: 800g Self-Raising Flour 200g Ground Almonds 500g Dried Mixed Fruits

2 Teaspoons of Ground Cinnamon

1 pinch of salt

- Now add the other mixed ingredients to this large mixing bowl.
- Add some plant milk (either soya, almond, oat,) a little at a time and mix very well until it is a strong mix consistency, but not too firm.
- Add all contents of bowl into baking tin, smooth over top slightly with knife.
- Place blanched almonds over the top of the unbaked cake following layout in photo.
- Place baking tin and contents into oven for around an hour or so.
- Afterwards, remove from oven and test with clean knife into the cake. If knife comes out clean, cake is ready! Allow to cool and remove from tin.
- When it's cooled down, slice and enjoy with a cup of coffee!

Winter Driving

when preparing for any journey:

- Check your headlights! You MUST use headlights when visibility is seriously reduced.
- Can you stop? In wet weather, stopping distances will be at least double those required for stopping on dry roads. This is because your tyres have less grip on the road. In wet weather
- Keep well back from the vehicle in front.
- If steering becomes unresponsive, ease off the accelerator and slow down gradually.
- Remember the rain and spray from vehicles may make it difficult to see and be seen.

- In winter check the local weather forecast for warnings of icy or snowy weather. DO NOT drive in these conditions unless your journey is essential. If it is, take great care and allow more time for your journey. Take an emergency kit of de-icer and ice scraper, torch, warm clothing and boots, first aid kit, jump leads and a shovel, together with a warm drink and emergency food in case you get stuck or your vehicle breaks down.
- You MUST be able to see, so clear all snow and ice from all your windows.
- You MUST ensure that lights are clean and number plates are clearly visible and legible.
- Make sure the mirrors are clear and the windows are demisted thoroughly.
- Remove all snow that might fall off into the path of other road users.
- Check your planned route is clear of delays and that no further snowfalls or severe weather are predicted.

If you find your car starting to skid:

Accelerating too hard can also cause skidding. In icy conditions, some wheel spin may be inevitable. To minimize the spin try engaging a higher gear.

Braking hard on a slippery road can also cause your car to skid. Your wheels can lock up and you will continue onwards with little or no braking effect. The locked wheels will also prevent you from steering. If this happens you should release the brake pedal to free the wheels then reapply the brake very gently.

On a slippery road if you start to skid when turning a corner:

- Remove your foot from the accelerator. This throws the weight balance of the car forwards and helps the tyres find grip.
- Do not use the brake.
- As the tyres find grip, carefully steer the car in the direction of the skid. For example, if the rear of the car skids to the left, steer smoothly to the left

Resolute Resolve

Around the world, people have been making resolutions for around four thousands of The ancient Babylonians made promises to their gods at the start of each year that they would return borrowed objects and pay their debts. Romans made promises to the god Janus, who January is named after, while Medieval knights made "peacock vows" once Christmas was over to re-affirm their commitment to chivalry.

Did you know that a massive 88% of those who set New Year Resolutions break them. despite the fact that 52% of the study's participants confident of success at the beginning? There are two main ways to get around this difficulty:

SUPPORT

Women succeed 10% more when they make their goals public and get support from their friends.

Resolutions are easier to keep when shared, both in terms of who vou'll share the benefits of your resolution with, and who you share the path of maintaining your resolution with. Support from friends, and colleagues certainly makes a difference in success rate with new year's resolutions.

BITESIZE TARGETS

Men, on the other hand, manage to achieve their goals 22% more often when they set measurable themselves а target, such as, lose a pound a week, instead of "lose weight". When you set small goals, they much more easily achieveable. A list of small goals, one after the other, enables you to take each step at a time, rather than trying to keep the determination on a year-long quest to "get fit".

It's easy for us to list our own resolutions but for school age children making and sticking to them can be more difficult.

Pre-school age children are the ones who may need a little help to learn some simple behaviours that will last them a lifetime. These are the sorts of resolutions they can make:

- I will brush my teeth twice a day
- I will wash my hands after going to the loo and before eating.
- I will tidy up my toys
- I will try not to argue with my brothers and sisters
- I will be kind to other children and to pets
- I will do my homework in time
- I will go to bed on time
- I will remember my manners and always say please and thank you
- I will drink more water and less fizzy pop
- I will tidy my bedroom and keep my clothes off the floor
- I will never give out personal information such as my name, address or telephone number on the Internet or to strangers
- I will be nice to other kids and especially friendly to children who need friends like someone who is shy, or is new to my school
- I will make mum and dad a cup of tea once a week
- I will plant some bulbs in the garden this spring
- I will try to find a new sport or an activity that I like and do it at least three times a week!



The Allotment Secretary by Tim Brooks

monthly jottings here are usually focused on the outdoors and the ways of growing vegetables and fruit on the plots. But at this point of the year it's usually too cold and wet for outside work. Gardeners being confined to occasional visits to greenhouse for making early sowings, long for the warmer and brighter days ahead.

However, being secretary and treasurer at our allotment site in Burton, there is always a range of tasks to do early in the year, such as preparing for the AGM (annual general meeting) which we have during January, as a rule, where all the committee members including myself and the chairman, face re-election or not as the case may be. The association members (the plotholders) get to vote at the meeting, who they'd prefer or want on the committee for the coming year.

AGM's are always interesting or memorable for various reasons. Someone might say something to provoke a heated debate, or a member may hold grudge against another plotholder, so they might decide to try to vote him or her out of their position. I'm guessing it's the same everywhere that has committee.

There are of course certain aspects of the secretary job,



which include discipline on the site and keeping allotment plots tidy through the year. If a certain plot gets too untidy, then that plotholder must either get it tidied up or face eviction, otherwise it is not fair on those who do keep their vegetable plots in a neat and well planted state, as weeds spread easily. At the AGM any potential new plotholders fill in forms to join. Our landlords are the local parish council, so they set out these rules that we all must follow. There is quite a bit of paperwork involved for a secretary on an allotment site.

As treasurer, I am entrusted with looking after the finances and spending at our site. Early this year we were fortunate enough to get a 'national lottery community fund' payment for some new sheds, which was fantastic and it has improved the site a lot. Recently I got another grant from another funding source, that has enabled us to get compost bins for all the plots on the site.

The rents taken each year would not fund much in the way of projects, so outside funding is essential nowadays for allotment sites to improve. Unfortunately а allotment sites around the UK being lost developments, with councils pressures government, to build more affordable housing. So I feel we must keep our site looking it's best to prevent it going the same way. The good news is, plots are currently in bigger demand due to rising food costs and the needs to improve mental health, which the great outdoors can be a big factor in helping with.

So, allotments play a vital part in fitness, providing food and our mental well being too.
