

"And did those feet in ancient time. Walk upon England's mountains green?"

s we move into March and the meteorological beginning of spring, the local farms become busier and busier.

As many sheep farmers are busy lambing still and the cattle herds begin spring calving, time becomes precious.

Ewes have been vaccinated in time beforehand, to also give the new born lambs immunity from infection in the first few weeks, but by the time the lambs are about 6 weeks old, that immunity can be wearing off.

Early calving is probably inside until the weather really improves and cattle overwintered in the sheds can be turned out. For us, spring heralded our regular TB test and, if passed, our cattle would go straight (weather and ground permitting).

The saying, "a speck of March dust is worth a Kings ransom" says it all, really. After a wet February, a dry month allows for the spring work to be carried out in relative ease and the grass and crops can recover after winter, with the ground beginning to become

workable for any spring-sown varieties.

When asked if he could remember any sayings appropriate for the time of year, hubby announced all he could remember was " it was bloody hard work most of the time!"

Slurry spreading continues for that all-important nutrition and more fertilizer is used on crops and grassland. Prices since the Ukraine war have increased by 77%, according to Defra figures (whereas food inflation is at 16.9%), and this makes life extremely difficult for farmers who are already coping(or not) with reducing farm support.

Crop spraying will begin when growth and weather conditions are suitable. When products become expensive, they are used extremely judiciously and this applies to many products, covering the whole range of agricultural sectors.

Any hedge-laying needs to finish soon, as the hedge begins to shoot and trimming must cease

by the start of this month to allow for growth and nesting birds.

One of the earliest birds to start nesting is the Tawny owl, which will have its first clutch of eggs by the end of the month. Maybe this is partly because, until the grasses etc get growing, prey is more accessible and ensures the babies can be fed.

And who hasn't come across the fluttering in the window on a sunny day of an over wintered butterfly struggling to escape through the glass? Orange-tip and Brimstone tend to be seen outside as the weather begins to warm.

Ted, our ex- working dog has settled into retired life and has learnt to be happier ignoring other dogs while out walking and loves a snooze in the sun. much to our relief, whereas I, on the other hand, will be helping a farming friend out with their lambing season (but I can stipulate no night work!).







Potty About Mum

Day gift can be a nightmare and with it fast approaching on 19th March this year, don't leave it too late to decide what to do. You know Mum deserves better!

If you're looking for a lovely gift that you can make yourself. Why not have a go at decorating a custom plant pot for your Mum, you can make it as classy or whimsical as you like to fit with their personal style. For extra brownie points, why not pick up a plant to go in it too?

Decorated Plant Pots

You will need:

- acrylic paints or paint pens such as 'Posca' pens
- brushes

- a pencil
- spray varnish (matt, silk or gloss depending on the finish you want)
- a terracotta pot (or other matt finish plant pot that isn't glossy otherwise the paint wil slide around)

Method:

That hardest part is probably the design that you will paint on the pot. Have a play on a pice of card or paper first and experiment with the paints and your design.

Choose your base colour and paint the pot or leave natural if you'd prefer.

You could use stamps made from sponge, or professional ones from a craft shop to print designs onto the surface.

Try geometric shapes like dots, or stripes or zig zags. You

could even try more organic shapes like leaf shapes (trace around some) or wavy lines and blob shapes. The options are endless.

If you are working with multiple colours, let each colour dry before you paint next to it if you want clean lines between colours. Wet paint next to or on top of other wet paint will give a softer look.

When completely dry, spray with the varnish following the

Who's a Pretty Pet?

The pet trend of the last year seems to be keeping birds. From chatty Ringnecks and beatboxing Tiels to clownish Caiques these animals are all over TickTock and Instagram.

If you are thinking about taking on a bird as a pet we advise that you do not do this lightly. As with all pets, they can take over your life, but birds require an extra special amount of care and have specific veterinary needs and housing when you go on holiday.

Unfortunately, there are lots of things around our houses that could harm our birds and be potentially fatal.

Because birds have sensitive lungs, toxins in the air can be especially dangerous. In general, anything with a 'strong smell' should be treated carefully. As a rule, it's always best to keep any product that gives off strong fumes away and open windows to help ventilate the area.

When keeping pet birds, avoid:

Candles: This may seem obvious, but the fumes from incense and both scented and non-scented candles can be really harmful to pet birds.

Non-stick pans: Teflon and other non-stick coatings on pans release toxic fumes when they are heated up which can

cause sudden death in birds. Teflon coverings can also be found on irons, ironing board covers, heat lamp covers and on the inside of ovens.

Zinc: Zinc in wire cages, mesh, staples, nails and some toys is a common cause of poisoning in birds. Other sources of zinc can include fertilisers, some paints and pennies (minted after 1982).

Household cleaners: As with all pets, direct contact with many household cleaners can harm your pet birds. The fumes from cleaners can also harm them.

Beauty products: Hairspray and nail varnish can both cause harm to your birds, especially if used in close proximity to them.

Smoke: Smoke from any source, including cigarettes as well as from wood-burning stoves or open fires, can be fatal to pet birds. Remember some smoke can linger in the air and on surfaces after its source is gone. Don't let pet birds in rooms with fires even when they aren't on.

Plants: Many plants can be toxic to birds and birds like parrots and parakeets are particularly inquisitive and may be more likely to investigate plants by eating them.

Human foods: Parrots in particular like to chew anything they can get their claws on, which might include human food. It's best to avoid feeding them human foods that in general as many of our

foods (especially those high in fat, salt, sugar or dairy) can be harmful. Keep food like chocolate, alcohol and caffeine completely away from your birds. Avocado toxicity can cause sudden death so it should never be fed to pet birds.

Glass windows and doors: Windows aren't just dangerous because your birds might escape if they're left open. Birds might not see glass clearly and may try to fly through it, even if it's shut. A collision can seriously hurt or even kill them. Try to make your windows more visible to birds by making glass panes more obvious with decals or use blinds or curtains.

Toys: Toys are an absolute must to keep your bird's mind active, and your birds will love to play with them. Most toys available to buy should be petsafe for birds but there can also be potentially dangerous toys on the market.

Dame Shirley Bassey

Born in Tiger Bay in Cardiff to a Nigerian father and English mother, Bassey recorded three of the most iconic James Bond title songs: Goldfinger (1964), Diamonds Are Forever (1971), and Moonraker (1979). Dame Shirley as had albums in the UK charts in seven consecutive decades. All hail Queen Shirl!

Sir Anthony Hopkins

Hopkins' portrayal of serial killer Hannibal Lecter in The Silence of the Lambs won him his first Oscar in 1992; his second Oscar came at the age of 83 for his performance in The Father. Fellow actors Richard Burton and Michael Sheen are also from his home town of Port Talbot.

Catherine Zeta-Jones

The Swansea-born actress won an Oscar in 2003 for her performance in the musical Chicago, and a Tony in 2010 for her Broadway performance of A Little Night Music. She's one half of a Hollywood power-duo with husband Michael Douglas. 'Zeta', by the way, was the name of a ship that her great-grandfather sailed on.

Sir Tom Jones OBE

'Jones the Voice' released his 41st studio album, Surrounded by Time, at the age of 81. The son of a Pontypridd coal miner, Jones first hit the charts in 1965 with It's Not Unusual, and has explored multiple musical genres from R&B to gospel. Be Happier & Healthier with Food

ating Disorders
Awareness Week (27th
February - 5th March) is
an international awareness
event, fighting the myths and
misunderstandings that
surround food related mental
illnesses that that affect 1 in 50
people in the UK.

Recovery is possible, is reliant on GPs to spot early warning signs that may have nothing to do with a person's weight or appearance. Their role is crucial and their responsibility is huge, but the average GP receives less than 2 hours of training on eating disorders throughout their medical degree. Often, people with eating disorders don't get the help they need because GPs just don't have the right training to diagnose them.

There are many different eating disorders and many people will have heard of Anorexia Nervosa, Binge Eating & Bulimia Nervosa but have you heard of these?:

ARFID - Avoidant restrictive food intake disorder, more commonly known as ARFID, is a condition characterised by the person avoiding certain foods or types of food. They might be very sensitive to the taste, texture, smell, or appearance of certain types of food, or only able to eat foods at a certain temperature. This can lead to sensory-based avoidance or restriction of intake

They may have had distressing experience with food, such as choking or vomiting. or experiencing significant abdominal pain. This can cause the person to develop feelings of fear and anxiety around food or eating, and lead to them to avoiding certain foods or textures. Some people may experience more general worries about the consequences of eating that they find hard to put into words, and restrict their intake to what they regard as 'safe' foods. Significant levels of fear or worry can lead to avoidance based on concern about the consequences of eating.

Orthorexia - Orthorexia refers to an unhealthy obsession with eating "pure" food. This doesn't mean that anyone who subscribes to a healthy eating plan or diet is suffering from orthorexia. As with other eating disorders, the eating behaviour involved "healthy" or "clean" eating in this case – is used to cope with negative thoughts and feelings, or to feel in control. It can also physical problems, because someone's beliefs about what is healthy may lead to them cutting out essential nutrients or whole groups. All eating disorders are serious mental illnesses, and should be treated as quickly as possible to give the sufferer the chance fully best of recovering.

Pica - Pica is a feeding disorder in which someone eats nonfood substances that have no nutritional value, such as paper, soap, paint, chalk, or ice. For a diagnosis of pica, the behaviour must be present for at least one month, not part of practice. cultural developmentally inappropriate - generally, it's not diagnosed in children under the age of two, as it is common for babies to "mouth" objects, which can lead to them accidentally eating substances that aren't meant to be eaten. Often, pica is not revealed until medical consequences occur, such as metal toxicity, cracked teeth, or infections.

Rumination Disorder - Rumination disorder is an illness that involves repetitive, habitual bringing up of food that might be partly digested. It often occurs effortlessly and painlessly, and is not associated with nausea or disgust. Rumination disorder can affect anyone at any age.

Lovely Seasonal Lamb

s we head into spring, lamb is coming into season. Delicious as a traditional roast leg or shoulder is, it can be nice to find new ways to use this, hopefully locally farmed, meat.

Here we've got a superb lamb burger recipe for you to try with a fresh Greek twist!

Lamb & Tzatziki Burger

Ingredients: Lamb Burgers

1kg lamb mince 1 onion, finely chopped 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped 2 tsp ground cumin 1 tsp ground coriander 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon 1/2 tsp ground allspice 1/2 tsp dried chilli flakes 2 tbsp chopped flat-leaf

parsley 1 egg

Jar roasted peppers 6 ciabatta or sourdough rolls

Tzatziki:

280g Greek-style yoghurt 1 cucumber, grated 2 garlic cloves, grated 2 tbsp chopped mint, plus extra leaves to garnish

Method:

• Place the lamb, onion, garlic, spices, parsley, egg and some salt and pepper in a bowl. Mix with your hands until well combined, then form into six burgers. Chill for 30

minutes.

• For the tzatziki, combine yoghurt, cucumber, garlic and chopped mint. Season, then chill until serving. Preheat a frying or griddle pan to medium-high. Cook the burgers for 3-4 minutes each side until cooked through. Toast buns, spread with tzatziki and fill with roast peppers, lamb and extra mint leaves.



The Allotment Treasurer by Tim Brooks

rell, the days are gradually getting longer and gardener's enthusiasm gets more intense as the growing season begins to get nearer. Some may already have started sowing a few things and I myself this month will be starting in my greenhouse, using my heated propagator to give seeds a head start. First I will be sowing my chillies, peppers and aubergines and even tomatoes, in pots with a bit of "perlite" mixed in with the compost. It helps with drainage. It's available in bags from the garden centre. Do not water the pots too much, otherwise they can get a bit too wet and seeds don't germinate so well. As soon as the seeds emerge in the propagator, I remove the pots to prevent the seedlings getting "leggy", so as to try to slow them down a bit. Keep them in a bright area of greenhouse, protected from frosts. Usually when seedlings get their first two leaves, you can pot them all up





into individual pots.

The past few weeks in my role as "allotment treasurer" at our site, it's been a busy period of collecting the yearly rents from our plot holders and doing the "admin" side of things. Doing the accounts sheet, making sure we've enough to cover the twice yearly water payments, as our site is on a water meter. Also the site insurance cover, a possible hedge trim to part fund, helped sometimes by the Parish Council funding some of it too. You need to ensure there is enough in the bank to cover these things and more as well. Last year we needed to buy a new petrol mower to trim the footpaths and car park So you need to be careful with spending as it's a fixed income. We have no electric on-site which in some ways is unfortunate, as a CCTV system would be great to have, but then we save on not having any electric bills, which

currently would be impossible to keep funded. Over the years we've had plot holders who have suggested spending our funds on bigger projects, like having stand pipes to each plot, so each plot can have its own water supply. dangers there are obvious. If someone left their tap running or an underground pipe burst, your water bill would be horrendous. Other suggestions included an onsite cafe/sitting room. I am not sure much gardening would have been done if that one had been approved! So spending has to be sensible and kept to a minimum.

It has certainly been a wet few months recently and little time to spend outdoors on the gardens. Hopefully we will get a decent springtime to catch up with the soil preparations and get an early start with sowing seeds. Last summer saw extreme heat, so think about sowing varieties that can withstand drier conditions in heat waves. Summers from now on could well be very similar.
